A Few of the Leaders that will make the Season of 1905 in this District.

"PENTLAND," (5072) (12269)

The property of R. Winslow, Lot 6, Con. 10, Cayan.

Pentland is a handsome bay, with white face and white hind legs, and a little white on near fore leg, foaled June 13, 1901, imported by T. H. Hassard, Millbrook.

Horsemen will do well to look into the excellent qualities of this noble young sire. His breeding is traced to the renowned Prince of Wales (673), and other such prominent stallions, all famous as prize winners.

Prince Bernard (4063) (12282) & **Sir Herbert** (4796) (1194)

The property of T. H. Hassard, Importer, Millbrook.

Prince Bernard is a dark brown, white star, a little white on one hind leg; foaled 1901. He is a most attractive colt, and has superior breeding.

Sir Herbert is a handsome bay, white strip on face, off fore pastern and hind legs white, foaled May 26th, 1901. He is typical Clydesdale. Among his ancestors are Ornament (10603), Baron's Pride 9122, the champion breeding horse of Scotland.

The Hospital for Sick Children, College Street, Toronto, appeals to the fathers and mothers of Ontario for funds to maintain the thousand sick children that it nurses within its walls every year.

The Hospital is not a local institution—but Provincial. The sick child from any place in Ontario who can't afford to pay has the same privileges as the child living in Toronto and is treated free.
The Hospital had last year in its beds and out-patient department, 287 of these were from 196 places outside of Toronto.
The cost is 98 cents per patient per day, and there were 129 sick little ones a day in the Hospital.

"GOOD DAY, DOCTOR." Since its foundation the Hospital has treated 10,371 children—a total of 7,500 of these were unable to pay and were treated free.
