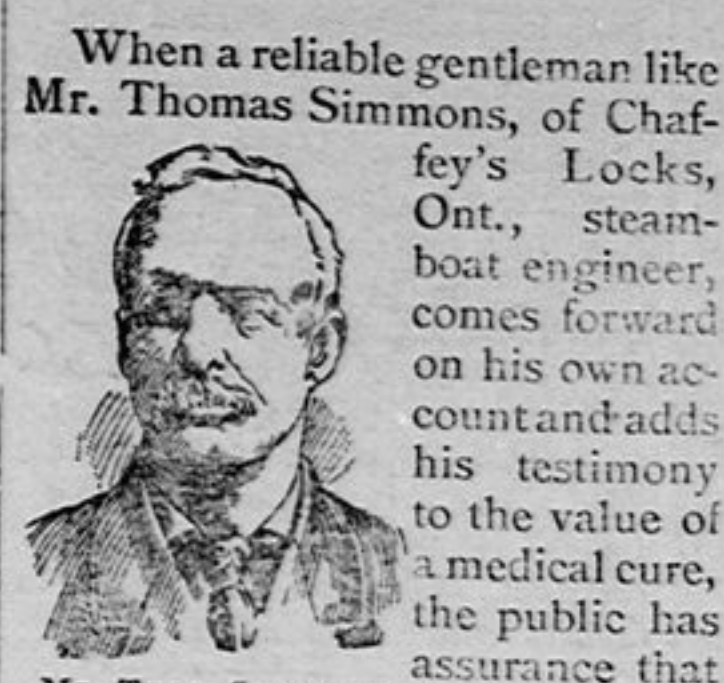
The program of the Concert on June 15th, will contain music from the great Masters of the 17th Century. See programs.

A large congregation was present in Christ Church on Monday morning at the funeral service, to pay the last respects to the late Miss Blanch Mitchell who died in Nichol's Hospital, in Peterborough, on Saturday, June 2. Until about 8 weeks ago the departed was fairly well. But on Monday, May 28th the Physicians decided that her sickness necessitated an operation, for which purpose she was taken to the hospital on Monday night. All proved to be well after the operation, till on Friday, the heart became weaker and the Doctors gave up hope for recovery. On Saturday the patient passed away quietly and without struggle. Blanch Mitchell is the daughter of Mr. Wm. H. Mitchell, on the 6th line in Emily. She was a girl of an amiable disposition and of a beautiful christian character. The body was brought from Peterboro to Omeme on the morning train and the funeral service was held in the Church. Rev. E. A. Langford took his text from Isaiah 40: 1, "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people saith your Lord." The family has the sympathy of the whole community in this their hour of trial. The circumstances are the sadder for the family since it was learnt that on the same day when Blanch died, a nephew of Mr. Mitchell in Meinte lost his life by an accident.
