CANADIAN BORDER PRIVILEGE.

A Member of the League of American Wheelmen Expelled For Abuse of the Regulations - Practical Points For Riders.

A district court in Milwaukee has recently rendered a decision of the utmost importance to wheelmen and the cause of cycling. It shows the right of county authorities to expend funds for cycle paths and verifies the constitutionality of a law passed by the legislature for the protection of these paths. It has been a mooted question with lawyers if county commissioners had the right to so expend money, as it was claimed that it would be class legislation to do so. The decision of this court settles the question and makes a precedent in law for all other states. The decision was arrived at after a three days' legal battle in which the League of American Wheelmen de- day. fended the bicycle side of the case, A. B. Choate, member of the national highway improvement committee, being the league attorney in the case.

The League of American Wheelmen has had its first expulsion of a member growing out of abuse of the privilege to cross the Canadian border without payment of duty upon showing a membership card in the L. A. W. A Bostonian did not comply with the condition which requires that cycling tourists shall leave a record of having left the country upon doing so, and the Canadian authorities held the league for the duty. As the member in question did not settle with the league he has been expelled. Though there are hundreds of L. A. W. members who avail themselves of this privilege annually and have been doing so for the past two years, this is the first case where a member has not kept his agreements with the authorities who have granted the privilege to the league. In a recent issue of Archiv fur Eisenbahnwesen is published an annual statistical table of the railroads of the world, a few of the figures of which will be in-

world amounted in 1897 to 454,730 miles, Members of the L. A. W. do not seem and in the five years from 1893 to 1897 8.9 per cent. The same year the total length of railroad in the United States was 184,278 miles, an increase in five years of 3.6 per cent. North and South America and the West India Islands are credited with over one-half of the total mileage or 236,218 miles. Next to the United States among the great nations is the German Empire, with a total of 29,880 mile, and then follows France with 25,073 miles. Russia with 25,003 miles, although, if we include the Trans-Caspian district of Russia and Siberia, Russia would come third with a total of sia are Great Britain and Ireland, 21,390 miles; British India, 21,000 miles; Austria-Hungary, 20,908 miles; British North America, 16,684 miles, Italy, 9,714 miles, and the Argentine Republic, 9.422 miles. Belgium has the largest amount of railroad in comparison with its total area, the amount being 82.2

miles for each square mile of area. In comparing the countries by the length of railroad compared with the amount of population that they serve, we find that the colony of South Australia stands first with 52.3 miles for each 10,000 people, this result, of course, being due to the comparative sparseness of the population. In the United States there are 26 miles to each 10,000 inhabitants, In the more densely populated districts of Europe the figures fall considerably, Germany having 5.2 miles for each 10,000 people. The small increase of 3.6 per cent. in the total mileage for the United States is due to the fact that the years 1893 and 1897 were among the least active in railroad construction in the history of the country, the previous decade having been one of extraordinary increase, over 12,000 miles, or more than half the present total length of railroads in Great Britain, having been built in a single year.
