With black ink selling at five cents or so a bottle, it seems hardly worth while for one to use home-made ink, but the trouble is that all black ink is not black by any means. The folslowing recipe, however, which, by the gun go off." way, is some 200 years old, tells you how to make a black ink that will not fade, and which is dead black in hue. Here is the recipe :

One quart of rainwater, filtered through a close-woven cloth, ounces of sulphate of iron, green copperas, two and a half ounces of gum arabic. Coarsely powder the galls and put into a bottle with the other chemicals; stir them up and add the water. Securely close the bottle and place in the sunlight, letting the botstirring the contents to bring this about. Shake the bottle each day for month or six weeks, then add some 20 drops of carbolic acid to prevent mold, and your ink is ready for use.
