VICTORIA CHEESE BOARD. The Victoria County Cheese Board met Monday in the market room, the council chamber being occupied.

Buyer Rollins—"I'm the man referred to. The cheese was in bad shape when I inspected it and I distinctly told the maker not to ship to me unless the patrons were willing to knock off the half cent a pound. The cheese was hurt by the excessive heat."

Buyer Rollins—"He will say say—he's an honorable man, and will not say anything different." President Robertson—"The cheese makers have labored under a great disadvantage owing to the extreme heat, and they should not have to stand the loss.

Buyer Rollins—"My experience has been that some makers do not take advantage of the facilities at hand during the hot weather. In going through the country I found that many makers shut up their curing room and prevented necessary circulation. Any man who has entered an empty passenger coach where all the windows are closed tight, will be able to realize the condition of many curing rooms during the hot spell.

Buyer Fitzgerald said that ice should be stored in cylinders—no other method was suitable for curing rooms. When his firm had introduced the ammonia freezing system into their cold storage warehouse in the east ward they removed a large number of these cylinders which he would sell at half price—50c each.

Buyer Fitzgerald said that an underground air duct leading from a dry well air chamber outside was better for curing room than ice, and would cost from \$50 to \$80 per factory. Mr. John Kennedy, of Dunsford, read a letter from Mr. Brenton, a shipper, which stated that the cheese shipped by Dunsford factory on the date referred to was worth one cent a pound less than usual.
