The annual fall fair of the Emily Agricultural Society was held at the Park in Omeme, on Monday and Tuesday of this week.

The weather was excellent, and the happy throng that wended their way to the grounds to exhibit and to examine the productions of skill and industry, made glad the hearts of the directors.

Large numbers from Millbrook, Lindsay and Peterboro were on the grounds, and spoke in eulogistic terms of the fair.

There was an excellent show of horses, cattle, sheep and swine. There were a few fine exhibits of poultry. The exhibits of grain, roots and vegetables were magnificent. The fruit display was first-class. In the general manufactures and agricultural implements there were a number of splendid exhibits. In the way of dairy produce, some first-class exhibits of butter and cheese were there. During the greater part of the afternoon there were a host of visitors to the large tents, where the fancy work of the ladies was on exhibition, and we must say that we never before saw such a large and handsome display here.
