Christian Endeavor Catechism.  
The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor?

The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor is an organization of people, the aims of which are the Bible, the deepening of spiritual life among the young people of the Churches and the carrying out of their Christian work in definite lines.

Where was it founded?  
It was founded in Portland, Me., as a church organization, by Rev. F. W. McKim, the President now, a Canadian.

What are its distinctive features?  
Its distinctive features are: 1. Its pledge and the consecration of its members. 2. Its covenant made by each active member in which he says: "Trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ for strength, I pledge Him that I will strive to do His will. He would like to have me do His duties as a church member and in which faithfulness is promised to his staff as a member of the Society."

What is the consecration meeting?  
It is a monthly prayer-meeting in which each active member of the Society fulfils his pledge to take some part aside from singing.

Can the Society be formed in any church?  
It can and is subject to the pastor and church authorities though it is interdenominational.

How far does it extend?  
Over the greater portion of the world. How many members has it?  
Nearly four million and it has about 62,000 Societies besides representing nearly all branches of the Christian Church.
