The entertainment given in the Public Library rooms on Tuesday evening was a decided success, and reflects great credit on all who took part in rendering the program. The management committee, consisting largely of ladies, are to be congratulated on the success attending their labors; and the large attendance of citizens from the town and vicinity indicates the interest taken in the continuance of our Library and Reading Room. The chair was ably filled by Mr. T. C. Ivory, whose opening remarks made a strong plea for the continuance of our Library, and a request that the community at large should aid by an increased number of subscriptions and in other ways in rendering the indebtedness. The first speaker was Mr. Moffatt who entertained the audience with events and persons connected with the Relief of Making in which the speaker was a participator. Rev. W. M. Kannawin, B. D., gave a stirring speech, showing that under an Absolute Monarchy the royal family is educated by the State, but in a Democratic government where the people are the rulers, the State must see that the masses are educated, and that they are provided with literature to make of them enlightened citizens. Both speeches were appreciated. Time would fail us to follow in detail the various pieces in the program. But in brief we must say that the musical selections rendered by Mrs. T. C. Ivory, Miss Jessie Lamb, Miss Clancy, Miss Bella Speece, and Mr. Robt. Mulligan, and violin solos by the Misses Tweedie, elicited well merited applause; and the excellent accompaniments played by Mrs. J. J. Lang, Mrs. R. Mulligan, Mr. Geo. Norris and Miss Annie Ivory must not be forgotten, together with an excellent recitation given by Miss Pratt, school teacher. These entertainments are to be repeated during the winter, but that already given was worth 25c. instead of 10c, the fee charged; and the public will look forward with interest to similar entertainments about to follow.

The first Wednesday of each month is the regular day of meeting for the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, which has recently been formed among the Presbyterian ladies of our town. Hence, last Wednesday, at three o'clock, the Society convened in the basement of the Church, with a large attendance of members. Suitable devotional exercises were conducted by the President, Mrs. (Rev.) Kannawin, and after the business part of the meeting had been dealt with, the missionary program was taken up. This was introduced by a short paper on the physical features, climate & of "Japan" read by Miss Blaylock, after which those present were favored with a well rendered solo by Mrs. (Dr.) Rodgers. A second paper relating to the people of Japan and their customs was given by Mrs. (Dr.) Cameron, followed by a solo from Miss Thornton, which was pleasingly sung.
