And in the matter of the Construction of Cement Sidewalks on parts of King Street in the Village of Omeme in the County of Victoria.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 671, S. S. 2, of the said Act, that the Municipal Council of the Village of Omeme has constructed Cement Sidewalks on the North side of King Street from Colborne Street to Sturgeon Street, and on the South side of said King Street from Mill Street to Sturgeon Street at a total cost of \$1772.63, of which \$1438.86 is to be provided out of the general funds of the Municipality and \$333.76 is to be assessed against the property owners.
