

Final Meeting of Manvers Council

Bethany, Ont., Dec. 10, 1956. —The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on the above date, with all members present and Reeve Argue presided.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on motion of Brown and Malcolm. Carried.

The following communications were received and read:—Stuart Ryan Q.C., re advice, roadway at Pontypool: One school requisition S.S. No. 7 for \$500.00; Four sheep claims; Victoria County District H.S. Board, re the sanding of hills for school bus; A request from a sheep valuator, asking to be relieved of his duties for 1957; Health Unit, monthly report; Mountain Sanitarium, Hamilton, re hospitalization; Peterborough Civic Hospital, re hospitalization matter and several accounts.

On motion of Malcolm and Brown, it was decided to paint the initials M.T. on each roll of snow fence belonging to the Township. Carried.

Moved by McGill and seconded by Brown, that Boxing day be declared a public holiday in the Township of Manvers. Carried.

Moved by Brown, seconded by Jakeman that Mr. Alex. Egri be billed for \$5.00 to compensate for destruction of a 50 foot roll of snow fence. Carried.

On motion of Jakeman and Brown, the new schedule of pay for election day is to be as follows:—Deputy R.O. \$7.00 per day and 20c per mile one way for securing and returning the ballot box. Or 10c per mile one way for securing box and 10c per mile one way for the return of the ballot box. Poll Clerk to receive \$6.00 per day. Hall rents to be \$6.00 per hall. Carried.

On motion of Jakeman and McGill, the livestock valuator's are to receive \$2.50 per valua-

tion. Carried.

On motion of Brown and Malcolm, Earl Argue was to receive an allowance of \$29.00 for trips to Lindsay and Cobourg, plus long distance telephone tolls for 1956. Carried.

On motion of Jakeman and McGill, Russell Kerr was to receive \$300.00, being a refund of the deposit required re the gravel contract for 1956. Carried.

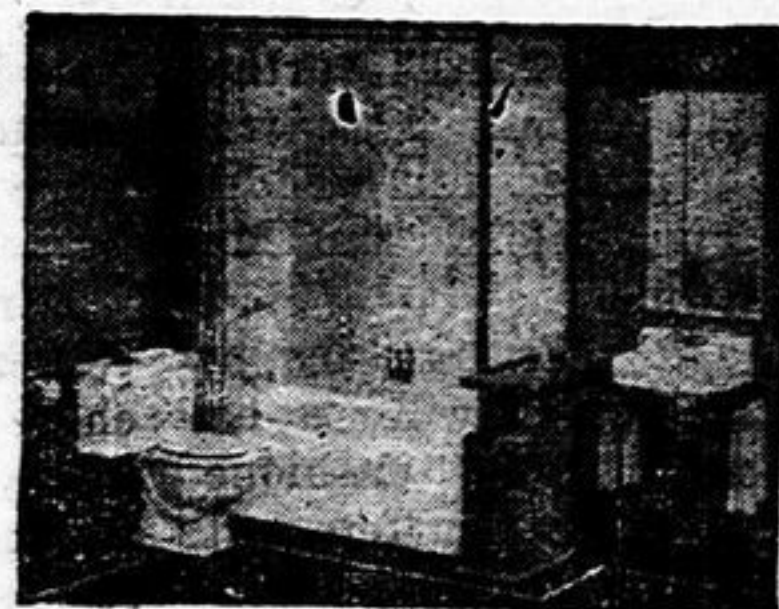

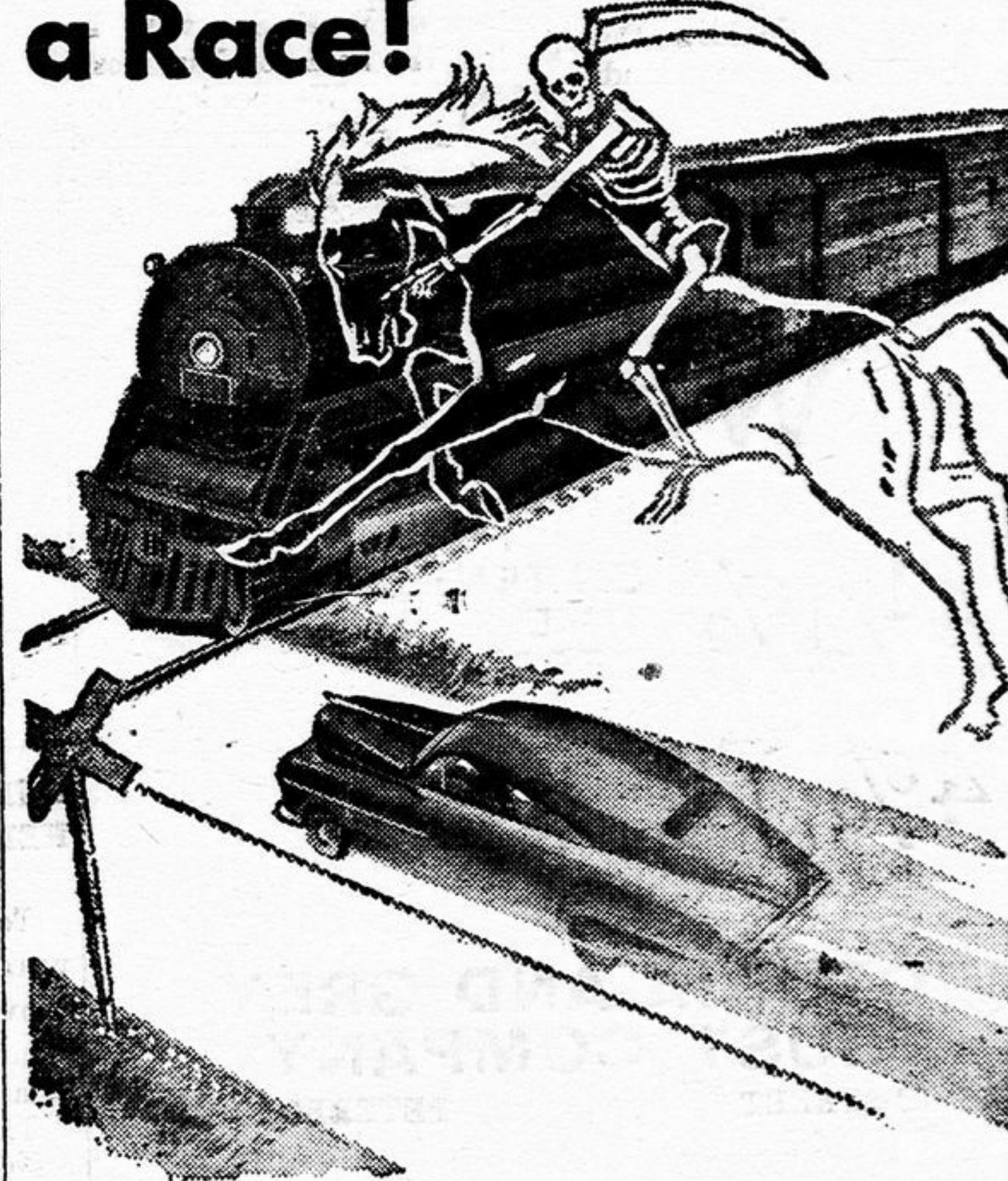
