Death came sudden to Merle McMahon, age 25, when the car he was driving collided head-on with a transport east of Belleville on Friday, January 25th. Two other occupants of the car, James McEachern, 21 of R.R. 1 Argyle, and Edward Johnston, 25 of Hastings, were also killed in the accident.

The funeral of the late Mr. McMahon was held on Monday from the J. W. Haw Funeral Home, Millbrook. He is survived by his young wife the former Anna Manley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Manley who reside on the Millbrook road about 2 miles from the village, and an 8 months old son, Murray. His parents Mr. and Mrs. Hilliard McMahon, three brothers and two sisters also survive. They are Kenneth of Bailieboro, Mrs. John Stone (Elva) of Toronto; Mrs. George Dunham (Helen) of Peterborough; Nelson and Verle McMahon of Bailieboro. The late Mr. McMahon was born in Bailieboro and had spent his entire life there. He was a member of Bailieboro United Church, and a member of Bailieboro L.O.L. No. 853, whose members along with visiting brethren held an Orange service at the Haw Funeral Home on Sunday evening. The funeral which was held on Monday was conducted by the Rev. Herbert Yarr of Bailieboro United Church. Interment was in Gardiners Cemetery, Millbrook.

The many floral tributes spoke of the high esteem in which deceased was held, and expressed sincere sympathy to the family of the young man.
