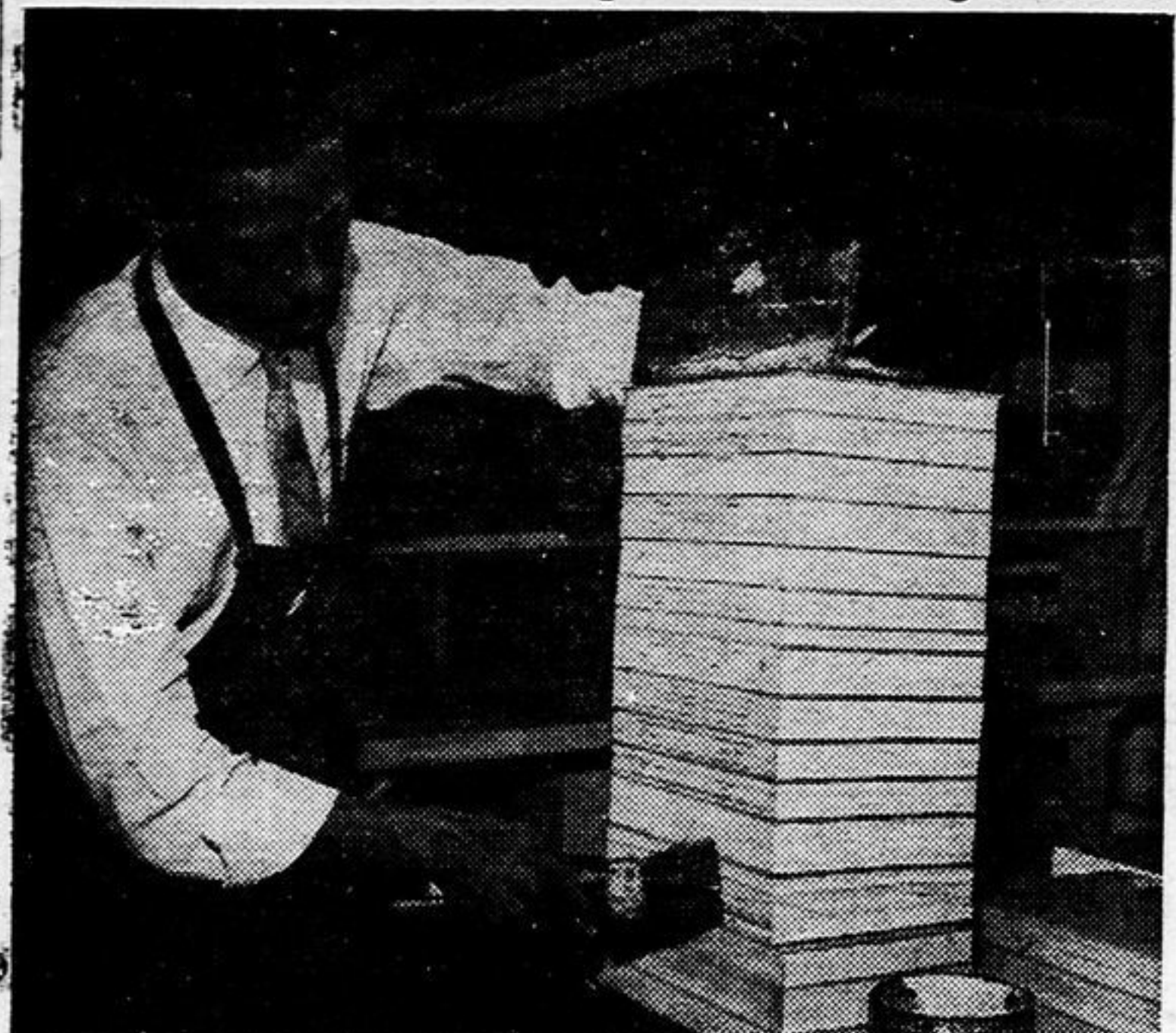

The U. N. Publishing Division has developed a simple and inexpensive method of bookbinding used for reference volumes. The method which has attracted the attention of libraries in various parts of the world requires only an ordinary paint brush, cold padding glue and an improvised rack for stacking the volumes. 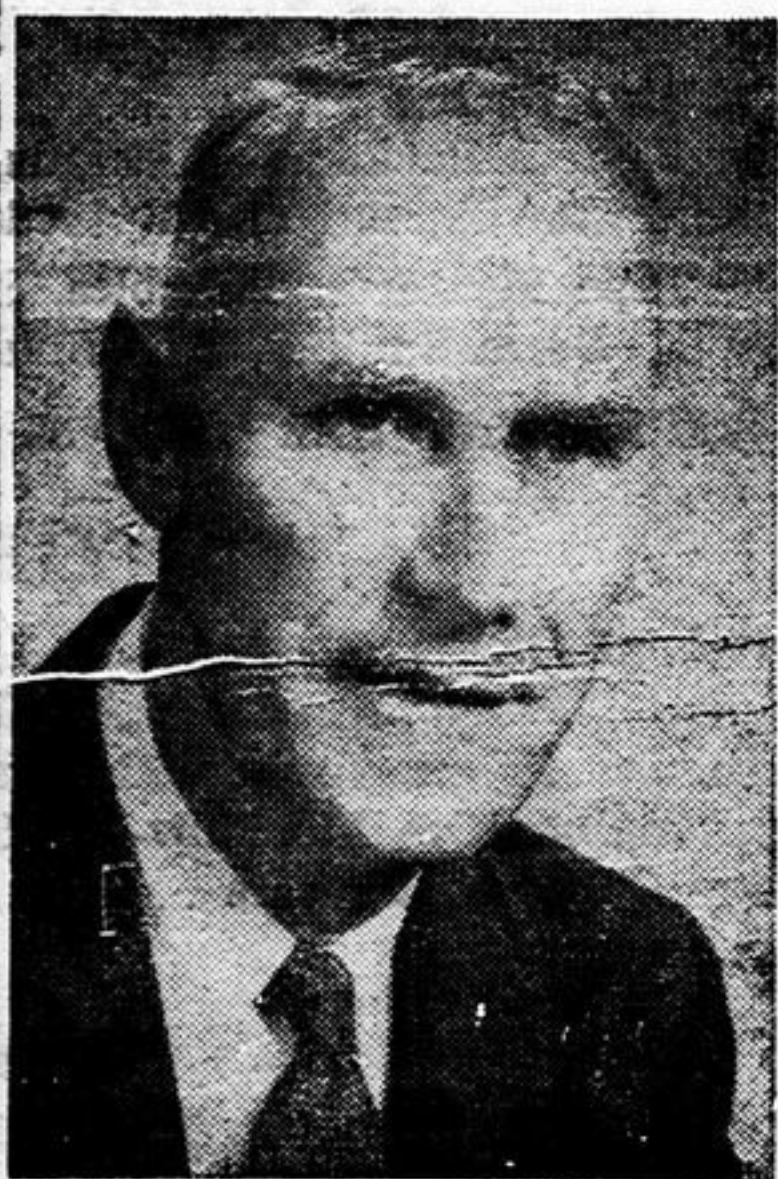
Parity For Canadian Farmers

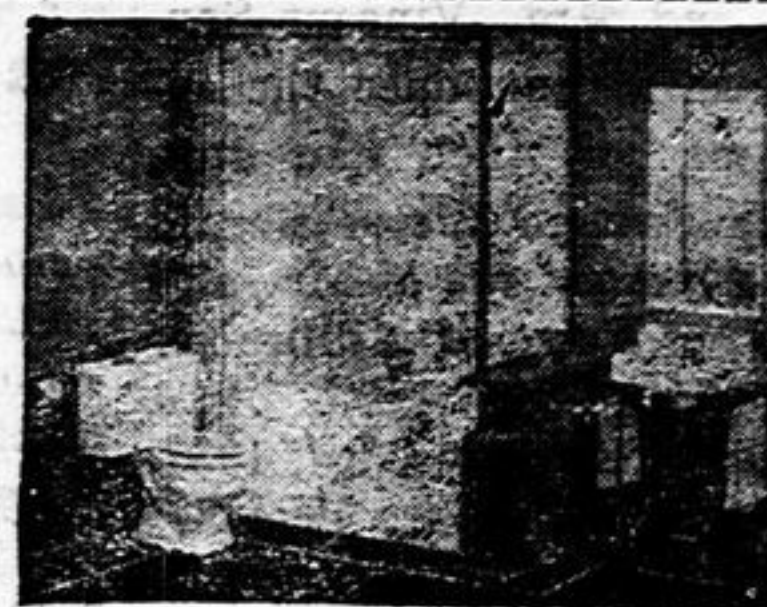
