Mervin Smith was appointed as delegate to the convention being held in Toronto on Feb. 27th and 28th and was instructed to choose one other member to accompany him.

A letter from F. A. Lashley of the Department of Agriculture said that the new policy of the department was to give grants to all fairs not just to the larger ones, and asked that forms stating expenditures should be filled in and returned.

Roy Ferren of Cavan and Jay Whittington of South Monaghan, were appointed as a committee along with the President to select the member of the society who should receive a service diploma.

Leonard Smith, the retiring president, thanked all members for their support and mentioned in particular the excellent help given by Mrs. P. I. Bentley, the secretary-treasurer. The society in appreciation of her work voted her an increase in salary.

Mervin Smith said he was following a good man as president. He would do his best and with the help of the retiring president, the secretary-treasurer, and all the directors, he hoped the high standard of the fair would be maintained.

J. H. McKnight introduced his friend, Frank King of Alameda, Sask., a director of the Estevan Agricultural Society to the meeting.

A meeting of the directors was called for Saturday, Feb. 16th to discuss advertising.—Peterborough Examiner.

Wednesday, June 12, date set for the 1957 livestock show by the retiring board of directors was confirmed by the new executive.

Reports were heard from the various directors of last year's show. Jay Whittington reported for the Clydesdale section and heavy harness class, Roy Ferren for Percherons, Ken Moncrief for Belgians, Fred Lowery for roadsters, Harry Young for Jersey cattle, Stewart Donaldson for Shorthorns, Mervin Smith for Herefords, the 4-H Calf Club, Aberdeen Angus, Ted McDowell and dual purpose Shorthorns, Tom McCamus.

The general opinion was that while the entry list was not quite as large as some years on account of conflicting dates with two other fairs, that the quality of exhibits was particularly high. Roy Ferren recalled that the heavy draft entry which placed first at Millbrook was second at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto. Mr. Ferren thought the pony classes should be revived.

Jay Whittington said there had been a fine display of 4 hitch horse teams in the heavy harness class with 7 or 8 entries.

Mervin Smith thought the 4-H Club class was about the same as the previous year. He announced the meeting on the coming Saturday at 2 p.m. in the waiting room to organize for the coming year, and hoped there would be still more entries. He asked that all those interested between the ages of 12 and under 21 should attend.

Entries in the various classes in the 1956 show numbered—horses 119, cattle 114, junior calf club for girls or boys 1 to 12 years of age 7, swine 33, 4-H Calf Club 17.

It was felt that if there was a weakness in the 1956 show it was on the entertainment side. The secretary-treasurer was requested to write asking further particulars about the adult ferris wheel and 30-foot merry-go-round offered in a letter from J. C. Roberts. It was decided that the Halliday Company goodwill trailer with loud speaker system should again be procured.
