

### Millbrook Council

Millbrook, January 13, 1958—The inaugural meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook for the year 1958 was held on Monday evening, January 13th, 1958, when the following elected Reeve and Councillors subscribed to the oath of office and took their seats:

Reeve—Geo. F. Harrington  
Councillors—Lavern Gibson, Frank North, J. T. Crowley, Gordon Trick.

The Reeve then called on The Rev. Francis P. Chisholm who was present to invoke Divine Guidance and assistance in the proceedings of the Council during the year just commenced.

The Reeve welcomed the members of the Council and congratulated them on their election to the board. He also expressed hope that all would work for the best interests of the Village. Each member in turn expressed a willingness to co-operate to that end.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and special meeting December 6th were read by the Clerk and on motion of Councillors North and Gibson were confirmed.

The following committees were appointed by the Reeve to look after the interests of the Municipality during the year: Streets, bridges sidewalks, policing, law and order—Chairman Frank North, Gordon Trick.

Millbrook Public Library: by Councillors Gibson and Trick that P. Hamilton be appointed member of this board. Term two years, commencing January 1st, 1958.

Millbrook and Cavan Memorial Arena Board: Representing the Council. Term one year, Frank North G. F. Harrington.

Representing North Cavan. Term two years, Elmer Hogg. South Cavan. Term two years, Dickson Hutchison.

Lions Club. Term two years, P. Hamilton.

Canadian Legion. Term two years, Weldon Coulter.

Athletic Association. Term two years, W. A. O'Brien.

Minor Hockey. Term two years, Vincent Crough.

Mr. Vincent Crough was present and addressed the Council in the interest of minor hockey.

Motion by Councillors North and Crowley that minor hockey be given a grant of \$25.00. Carried.

Mr. H. V. Kent interviewed the Council in the interest of fire protection.

Motion by Councillors Trick and North that the list received from the Fire Chief for supplies be referred to the Fire Department Committee and that they report at the next meeting of Council. Carried.

Motion by Councillors North and Gibson that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to complete a By-law to borrow from the Toronto-Dominion Bank a sum or sums not exceeding \$12,000. to meet, until taxes are collected the current expenditures of the year. Carried.

Communications were received from Reg. Dufty, Brown St., and Cecil Hubbard, King St., and read by the Clerk: Motion by Councillors Trick and Crowley that this Council recommend to the Millbrook Public Utilities Commission that street lights of 60 watt capacity be placed in the following places:

1. At the intersection of Brown and Hunter Streets.

2. On Bank Street in front of Russell Smith's residence. And that the application received from Cecil Hubbard be held on file for further consideration. Carried.

Motion by Councillors North and Crowley that this Municipality withdraw from membership, for this year 1958, from the Lake Ontario Development Association and that the Clerk forward notice of same. Carried.

Motion by Councillors North and Gibson that the Public Utilities Commission be authorized to have an engineer's survey made, an estimate prepared of the cost of an 8 inch water main from the intersection of King and Union Streets, and King and Tupper Streets. Carried.

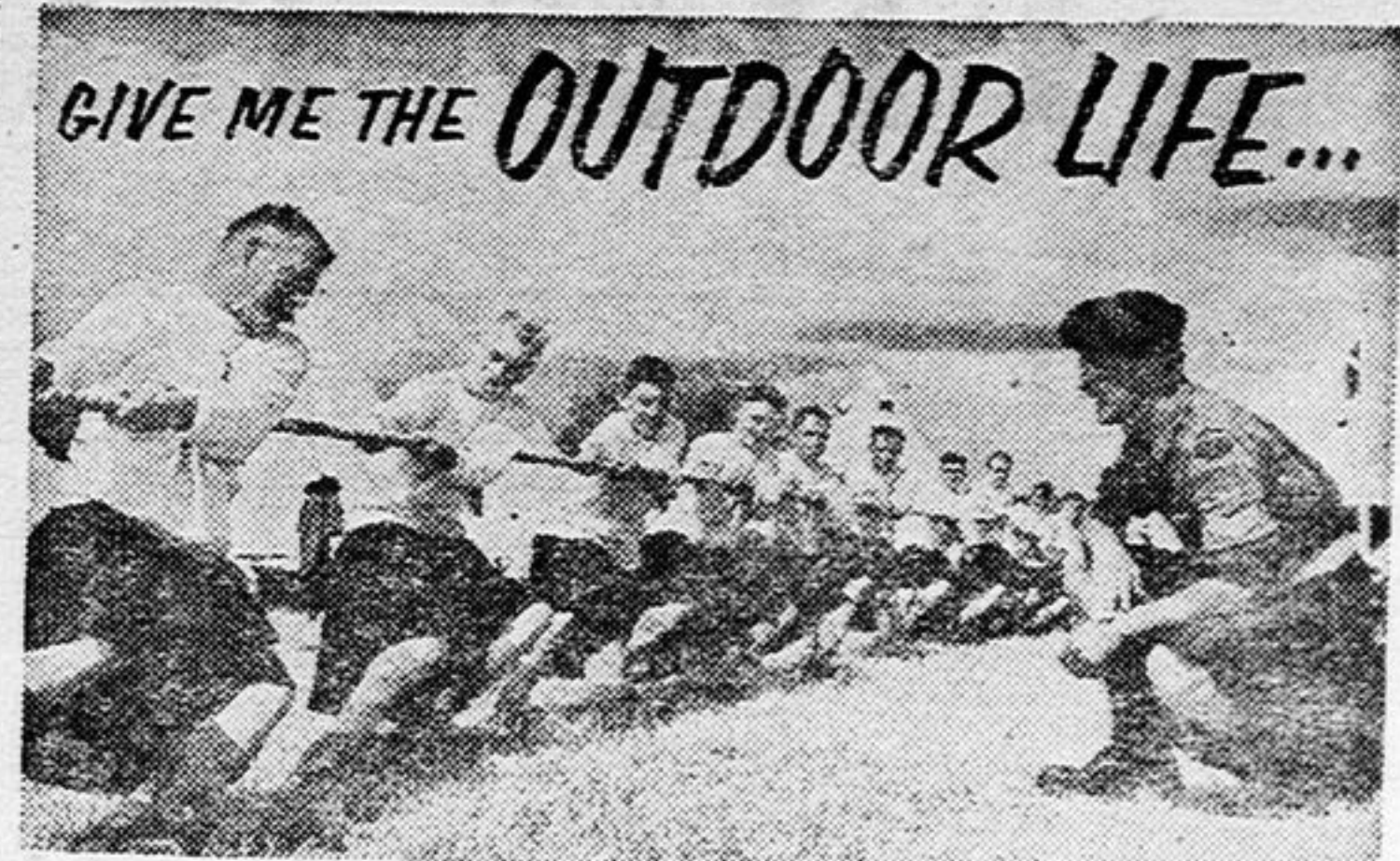
