

### Inaugural Meeting Manvers Council

Bethany, Ont., Jan. 13th, 1958.—The inaugural meeting of the Municipal Council of the Township of Manvers was held on the above date at 11 a.m. The following members of the 1958 Council subscribed to the Declaration of Office: Earl Argue, Reeve; Lewis McGill, Deputy Reeve; Robert Brown, H. M. Jakeman and Harvey Malcolm, Councillors.

Rev. R. R. Bonsteel of the United Church gave an appropriate address to the Council. This was followed by Scripture reading and Prayer. Reeve Argue thanked Rev. Bonsteel for his message and expressed the appreciation of the Council for his presence.

The Reeve and Deputy-Reeve each expressed their pleasure at being returned to office for another year and looked forward towards a successful and harmonious year in Municipal affairs. The Councillors in turn each expressed their pleasure in being part of the 1958 Council and looked forward to achieving many objectives in the new year.

Reeve Argue called for the

reading of the minutes of the last meeting.

On motion of Brown and Malcolm, the minutes were approved adopted as read. Carried.

Communications read: United Counties of N. and D., re an indigent patient. Ontario Good Roads Association, re 1958 membership. Requests for donations from the following organizations—Hospital for Sick Children, The Salvation Army, St. John's Ambulance and The Federation of the Blind. Dept. of Highways, re forms in connection with the road account. Dept. of Welfare, re new relief regulations. Sect.-Treas. U. S.S. No. 15 requesting an equalization of the School section before the 1958 levies are made. H.E.P.C. re several applications for flat rate water service. Imperial Oil Ltd., re a proposed site for a service station. Association of Assessing Officers of Ontario, requesting membership for 1958 and several sheep claims.

On motion of Jakeman and McGill the meeting adjourned for one hour for dinner. Carried.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm that Mr. Sidney Moss, Toronto, received a tax refund of \$20.75 as no house or cottage was on the lot as per building assessment. Carried.

On motion of Brown and Jakeman, no action was to be taken in regards to a relief matter, request. Carried.

Moved by Malcolm and seconded by Brown that the Salvation Army and Hospital for Sick Children, each receive a grant of \$10.00. Carried.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill, that membership be renewed in the Ontario Association of Rural Municipalities and the Ontario Good Roads Association. Carried.

On motion of McGill and Malcolm, By-law No. 1343, was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1343. This By-law is known as the Bank borrowing By-law, whereby the Township can borrow up to a limit of \$70,000.00 if the need should be, during 1958.

On motion of Jakeman and Brown By-law No. 1344 was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1344. Being a By-law appointing fence viewers, pound keepers, live stock and sheep valuers, a school attendance officer and a weed inspector for 1958.

On motion of Brown and Jakeman By-law No. 1345 was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1345. Being a By-law to authorize the Treasurer only to sign the road account cheques.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill that Mr. Mansel Wright be given authority to run a pipe across John Street underground. Carried.

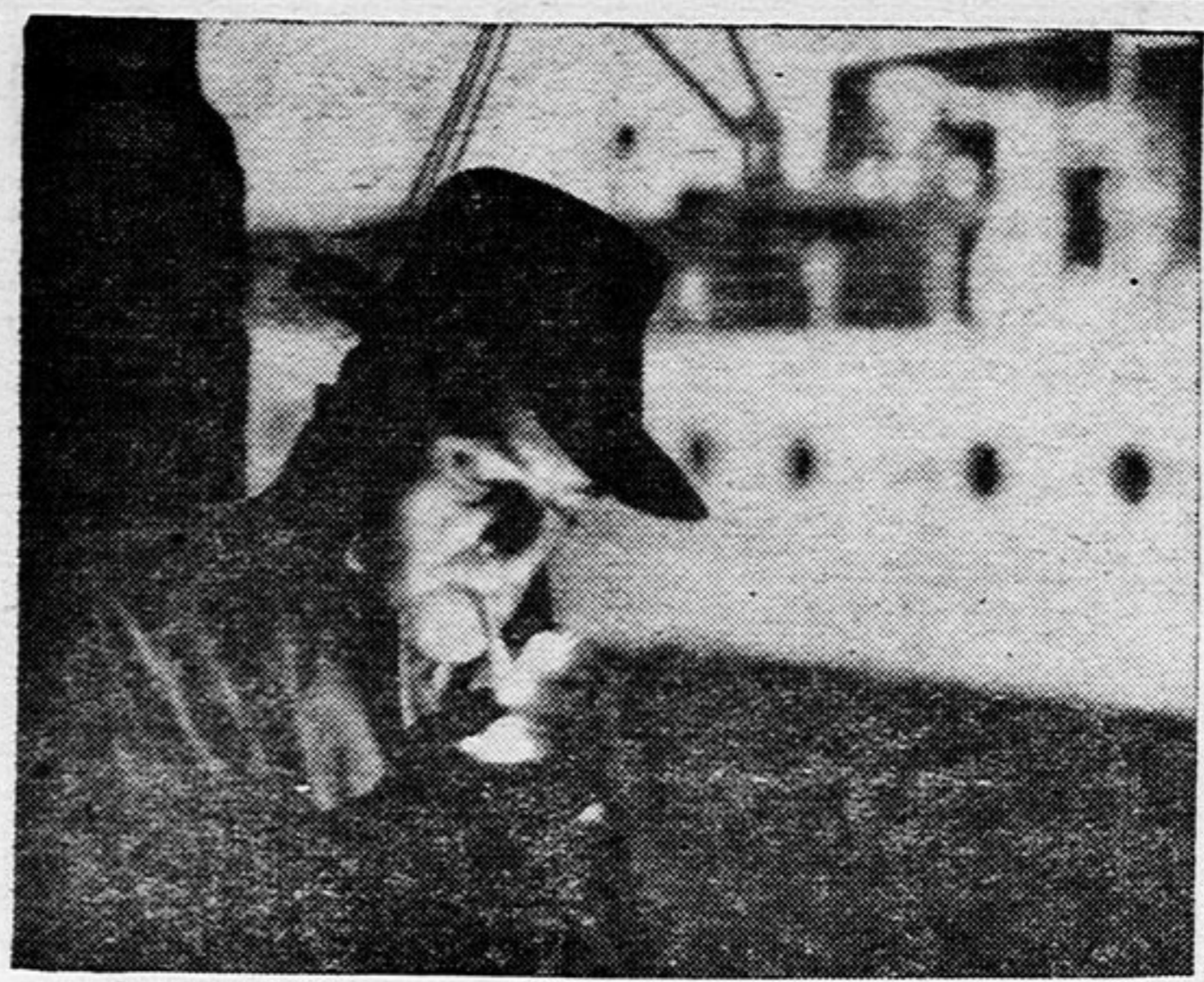

The financial reports presented at the annual meeting of Grace Presbyterian Church, Millbrook on Monday afternoon showed that the congregation had had one of the most successful years in its history. Lorne Farrow, treasurer, presented the financial statement for 1957. He was reelected treasurer of the Board of Managers and Nathaniel Belch was reelected secretary. Gerald Armstrong was appointed chairman.

Mrs. Gerald Armstrong, treasurer, presented the report of the Ladies' Aid Society. Receipts for the year were \$861 and expenditures including renovations on the Church building and manse \$668. During the year the floors of the Church and the hall were sanded and refinished. Men of the congregation, the Ladies' Aid and the Church School helped in this work.

Joseph H. Burns, superintendent of the Church School, presented the annual report. He was thanked by the congregation for his continued services in the Church School in his 20th year as superintendent.

The Session reort noted that Dr. Tom Belch, a member of the congregation, left in February last year as a medical missionary to the Near East. He and his wife have spent a year studying Arabic in Beirut, Lebanon. They are going this month to work and to witness for Christ among Moslems in Pakistan.

The report of the Women's Missionary Society prepared by the Treasurer, Mrs. J. R. Thompson, who was absent due to illness was read by the past President, Mrs. W. H. Heustin. The amount sent to Presbyterianial was \$235.00 Other amounts contributed in a total of \$68.00 included good literature

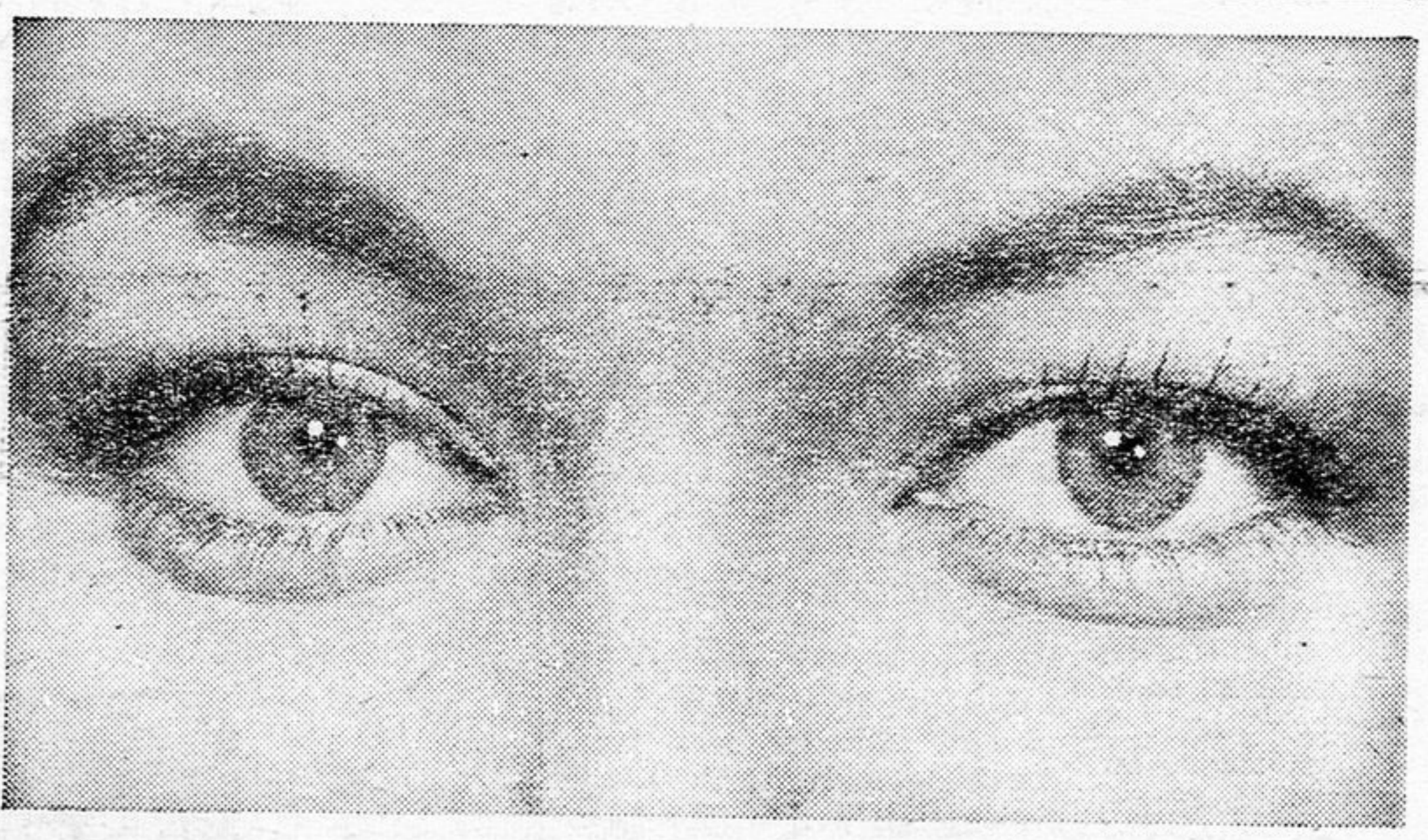
