

### South Monaghan Council Meetings

The Inaugural meeting of the Council of the Township of South Monaghan was held according to statutes on January 12th, 1959, at 10 a.m. in the Township Hall.

Mr. George Dean, Reeve Elect by acclamation, occupied the chair and spoke a few words of welcome to the three previous councillors and to the new councillor, Mr. Jay Whittington, who has had previous experience as Councillor and Reeve. Each of the Councillors replied suitably and pledged their support to the Reeve for the benefit of the Municipality.

After each member had signed the declaration of office, the minutes were read by the Clerk and adopted on motion by A. G. Anderson, seconded by Robert Fisher.

Rev. K. J. Campbell of Baillieboro was in attendance and addressed a few words to the Council, and Scripture reading with a closing prayer. A hearty vote of thanks was extended to Rev. Campbell on motion by A. G. Anderson, seconded by Robert Fisher.

Adjournment for one hour was passed on motion by Robt. Fisher and Herb Syer, at which time Rev. Campbell enjoyed lunch with the Council.

Session was resumed as per motion and the roads accounts were presented by the Superintendent in the amount of \$477.69. These were passed for payment on motion by Robert Fisher, seconded by J. Whittington. While on the question of roads, on motion by J. Whittington, seconded by Herb Syer, the Reeve and Clerk were authorized to sign the necessary forms for the balance of the 1958 road subsidy. Also, on motion by A. G. Anderson, seconded by J. Whittington, the hourly rate of the road superintendent was increased to \$1.30 and labour to \$1.00. A communication had been received from the Ontario Good Roads Association announcing the Convention in February and the membership fee was passed for payment on motion

On motion by Robert Fisher, seconded by Herb Syer the Reeve and Councillor Anderson were appointed a committee to meet with the Millbrook Council in regards to renewing the contract for calling the fire truck to the Township.

On motion by J. Whittington, seconded by A. G. Anderson the Reeve, Robert Fisher and the Clerk, were appointed a committee to interview the Bond Companies re sale of debentures.

Adjournment was called at 6.30 p.m. on motion by Herb Syer, seconded by Robert Fisher, to the call of the Reeve.

**SPECIAL MEETING**

At the call of Reeve Dean, a special meeting was held in the Township office on January 16th, 1959, at 8 p.m., at which time the Clerk had received bids from several Companies for purchase of the debentures, which were opened on motion by Robert Fisher, seconded by Herb Syer.

Since there was a slight difference in a schedule submitted by one of the Companies, the Clerk was asked to get further information and report to a meeting on January 17th. The Committee appointed to interview Millbrook Council reported that Municipality agreeable to renewing the existing contract for calling the fire truck, which contract will be forwarded and signed in the near future.

On motion by A. G. Anderson, seconded by Herb Syer, Robert Fisher was appointed to be in charge of fuel for the Township hall.

Borrowing By-law No. 645, Limited	on motion by J. Whittington, seconded by Herb Syer. However, the Clerk was asked to consult with this Company and come to final terms on the schedule, letter of acceptance to be mailed immediately.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Township realizes an over-expenditure of \$1,000.00 on their road programme and in this regards supplementary By-law No. 646 was passed and a request made to the Department of Highways to accept and pay the usual subsidy.

Meeting adjourned on motion by Herb Syer, seconded by J. Whittington.
