#### ORGAN RECITAL AT ST. THOMAS' CHURCH

Raymond Daniels of Orillia, organist of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Barrie, gave an organ recital in St. Thomas' Anglican Church on Friday evening. Assisting were Mrs. Lawrence Winslow, soloist, and St. Thomas' Choir under the direction of Mr. J. O. Medd.

Mr. Daniels included in his programme a group of old English organ numbers of the 16th and 18th centuries, a group of chorale preludes of the German school which included works of Buxtehude, J. S. Bach, and J. G. Walther; musical clock by Franz Josef Hayden and finally a group of modern composers, T. J. Crawford, Healy Willan, and Flor Peeters.

Mrs. Winslow sang "He Shall Feed His Flock" from the Messiah and "How Great Thou Art". The choir sang the anthem "My Faith Looks Up," by Ellen Jane Lorenz.

Mr. Daniels is chairman of the Orillia centre of the Canadian College of Organists, and a member of the national council.

#### GRACE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH HAS BANNER YEAR

Rev. Gilbert Smith of St. Giles', Peterborough, Interim Moderator of Millbrook and Centreville presided at the annual meeting of Grace Presbyterian Church, Millbrook, held in the Church Hall.

Mr. J. Burns, clerk of the session, in reporting the session report stated that no new members were received this year. The charge has been vacant since last April when Rev. W. H. Heustin accepted a call to Beamsville.

The Sunday School report showed a balance of \$71.74 after sanding and finishing of the Sunday School floor. This department last year sent a copy of Everyday into each home of the congregation.

Mrs. John Thompson, W.M. S. treasurer, reported that \$235.00 had been sent to the General Fund and a donation sent to the Good Literature Fund.

Mrs. Gerald Armstrong, in reporting for Ladies' Aid, stated that many improvements had been made in the manse, new carpets had been purchased and laid in the church with total receipts showing \$1,311.83 and a balance on hand of \$483.00.

The Church Treasurer, Mr. Lorne Farrow, stated that from a financial standpoint Grace Church had had one of the best years in history, all commitments met and a balance on hand of \$1,173.23.

In March a new Wurlitzer organ valued at \$4,770.00 was installed in the church. Mr. E. L. Armstrong, organ fund treasurer, reported that the organ was paid for with a balance of \$17.06 to be handed to the Church Treasurer.

The Every Home Plan for the Presbyterian Record was again accepted and heartily approved for 1959.

Mr. Gerald Armstrong and Mr. Clifford Larmer were appointed to attend the meeting of the Executive Council of Presbyterian Men in Cobourg January 25th.

Mr. J. Burns and Mr. L. Farrow extended a vote of thanks to Rev. Smith after which a social cup of tea was enjoyed.
