

South Monaghan Township Council

The regular meeting of South Monaghan council was held on February 7th, 1957, with all members present. On motion of H. Syer seconded by D. Fisher the minutes were adopted as read.

J. A. Gaynor the assessor interviewed the council regarding an increase in salary. It was moved by G. Dean seconded by G. Anderson that the salary for assessor only be increased to \$700.00 per annum, an amendment was moved by R. Fisher seconded by H. Syer that the salary be increased to \$700.00 and to include the office of building inspector. Carried.

On motion of G. Anderson seconded by R. Fisher the meeting adjourn to meet on February 11th, 1957 at 8 p.m.

Council resumed session on February 11th, 1957 at 8 p.m., all members present.

Moved by G. Dean seconded by R. Fisher that the clerk order the Municipal World for the Reeve, council, clerk, and tax collector.

Moved by G. Anderson seconded by H. Syer that the clerk endorse the communication from the Department of Lands and Forests re training for bush and grass fire protection.

Moved by H. Syer seconded by G. Dean that the council grant \$10.00 to the Salvation Army.

Moved by G. Dean seconded by H. Syer that G. Anderson interview Don LaForte in regards to warble fly spraying.

Moved by H. Syer seconded by G. Anderson that R. Fisher interview Harry Larmer in regards to acting as inspector on warble fly spraying.

Moved by R. Fisher seconded by H. Syer that the clerk purchase 200 lbs. of warble fly powder.

Moved by R. Fisher seconded by G. Anderson that the insurance on the township hall be increased from \$4000.00 to \$6500.00 and also to place \$500

on the contents of hall, this making a total of \$7000.00.

Moved by G. Anderson and H. Syer that the road superintendent advertise for tenders for 3000 yards of crushed $\frac{3}{4}$ gravel.

Moved by G. Anderson seconded by G. Dean that borrowing by-law No. 620 be given first reading.

Moved by H. Syer seconded by R. Fisher that borrowing by-law No. 620 be given third and final reading, passed.

POLIOMYELITIS IMMUNIZATINO CLINICS

A shipment of poliomyelitis vaccine has been received by the Northumberland-Durham Health Unit two weeks sooner than had been promised, states Dr. Charlotte M. Horner, Medical Officer of Health, so that the Health Unit staff is able to go ahead without further delay with the programme of providing clinics for the prevention of poliomyelitis for all children in the United Counties from the age of six months through high school. Already, first clinics have been held in the high schools in Bowmanville, Cobourg, Brighton and Campbellford.

Plans are being made for clinics for preschool children on dates as follows, the particulars to be advertised in the local newspapers:

NewcastleMarch 4 a.m.
ColborneMarch 5
BowmanvilleMarch 5, 6
CampbellfordMarch 7
CobourgMarch 11, 12, 13

Second doses to these preschool children will be given four weeks following the first dose. After that, Dr. Horner says, clinics will be held throughout the United Counties to give first and second doses to beginners and other elementary school children who have not received any vaccine, and third doses to those who received two doses last spring.
