**The Following Message is of Vital Importance To The Farmer, The Industrial Worker And The Small Businessman of Durham County**

If you are dissatisfied with the present system of government, regardless of the party which holds the power in Ottawa, and are interested in an effective alternative to the system, would you consider the following 13 points on which one of Canada's major parties will base its election platform this year?

1. Government shall keep out of business—let private enterprise, not social enterprise prevail.
2. Every person shall be free to manage his life; free to speak, to assemble, to work, to worship, to choose, to live, provided only that this same freedom is allowed to all others.
3. The people's elected representatives in Parliament shall be supreme within their jurisdiction without government by "boards" and "committees," and other vehicles which constitute "creeping socialism."
4. Every Canadian shall be given a chance to obtain a fair and just share of Canada's national production.
5. Government by the people at the "grass roots" level shall be made more and more possible by decentralization of power to the smallest governing unit.
6. Canadians shall be encouraged to produce in Canada more and more of their vital needs of shelter, clothing and food, as well as the tools to make them, and be shielded from unfair foreign trade practices such as "dumping."
7. Canada's natural resources shall be developed in Canada for Canadians of today and shall be husbanded and preserved for Canadians of tomorrow.

8. Full and free access of courts will be guaranteed to all, including the "little people", as well, regardless of financial cost, by providing not only crown "prosecuting" attorneys but also crown "protecting" attorneys.
9. What is physically possible and desirable shall be made financially possible.
10. It shall be recognized that every people on earth shall have the right of self-determination and unimpaird sovereignty, provided exercise of these rights shall not interfere with the same rights of other peoples or nations.
11. Man's right to think and act independently does not transcend his obligation to law.
12. The means to even a desirable end are never justified where fundamental principles are compromised, or where truth is ignored, or where human rights are set aside.
13. Only by recognizing our dependence upon the help of God and by humbly seeking to know His will can we possibly find our way through the perplexities that beset us, and into a state of peace and happiness at home and throughout the world.
