After minutes were read and received Miss Sutton, retiring president, asked for same loyal support as she had had for the new president Mrs. W. L. Elson. She also made mention of the loss of a valued member, Mr. T. A. Campbell, who was a loyal member since organization in 1939. All stood for one minute of silence as tribute to Mr. Campbell.

The Canadian Legion who donated a hospital bed and chair, were thanked by the Society on motion of Mr. Kerr seconded by Mrs. Campbell. J. H. Barringer was also thanked for looking after the loan cupboard.

It was decided to purchase another bed complete, mattress and rubber sheet.

The Society would appreciate very much if parties using Red Cross articles would return them immediately when through with them as other persons were in need of these articles.

Mr. H. A. Kerr, the treasurer gave his report showing receipts of \$1607.63 and expenditures of \$1056.59 leaving a balance of \$551.04 in the bank.

A motion thanking donors and collectors was also passed.

Mrs. Campbell, chairman of the Women's War Work Committee gave her report which showed 5 quilts, 12 girls sweaters, 27 girls pullovers, 6 boys pullovers and 1 knitted afghan shipped to Toronto in 1957.

Mr. A. R. Payne reported on the blood donors, showing that 11 donors from Millbrook and surrounding county had made donations in this line.
