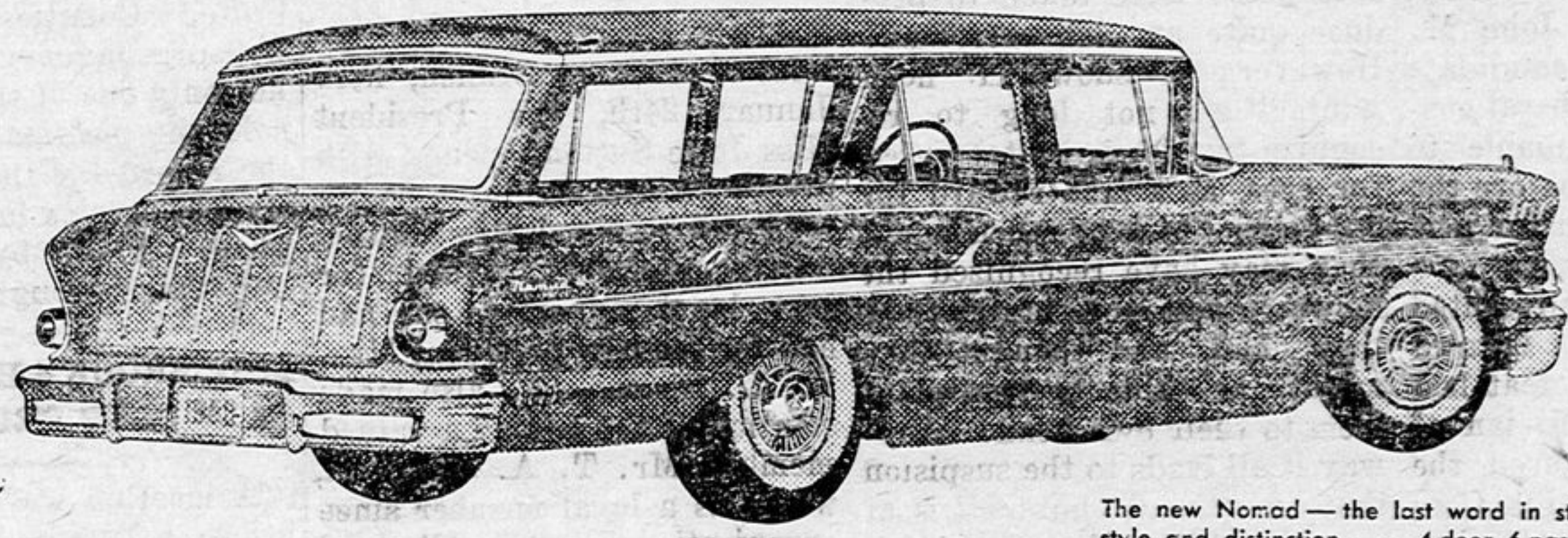

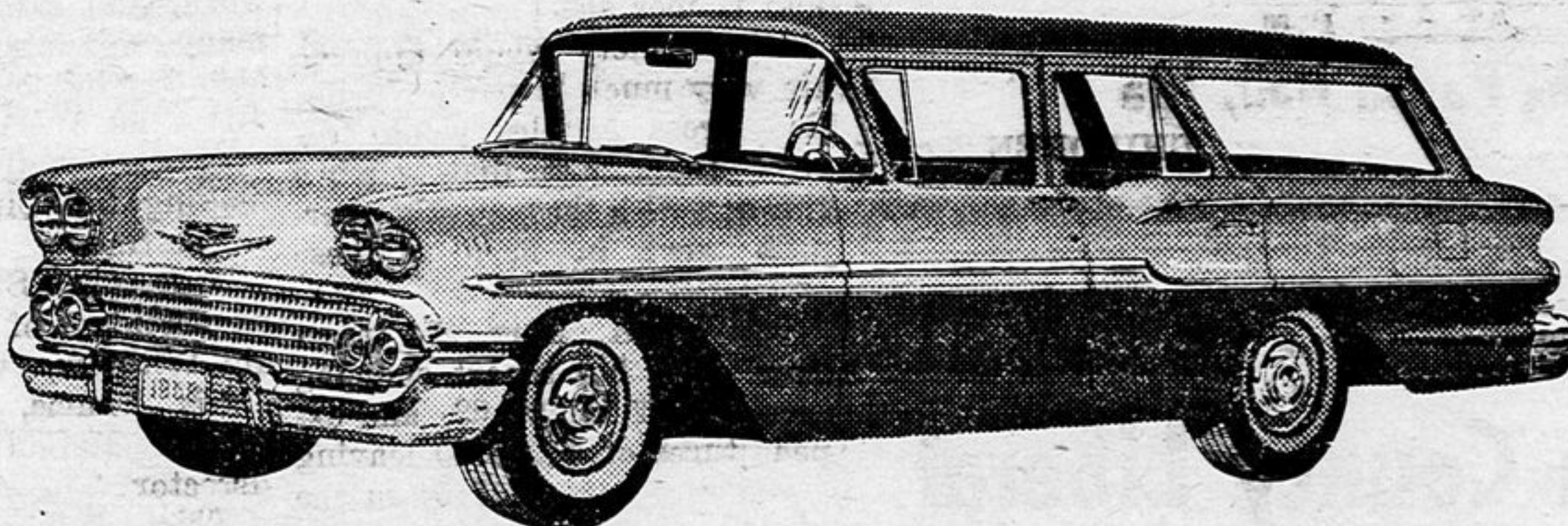

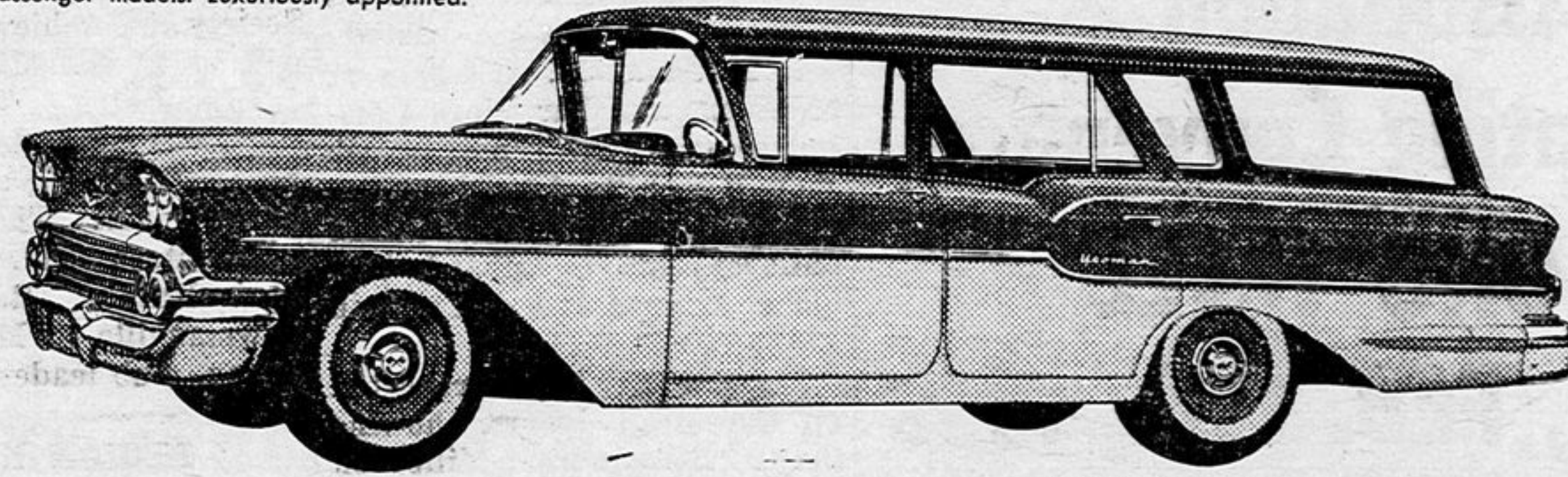

"The overcrowding situation at Millbrook high school, described as desperate in County Council a week ago, has been detailed by school principal Raymond Goheen and Regina Fallis, Cavan Township representative on the Durham County district high school board.
C. G. Allin, counties representative on the board, to council 'there is a real problem in Millbrook, and that there are only four teachers in the high school here. He recommended a new school in the village. Millbrook's Reeve George F. Harrington said the village population was rising, particularly with the arrival of students at the new reformatory, and the resulting pressure was hitting both the high and public schools.
