BEEF PRODUCERS FORM ORGANIZATION MEETING AT BETHANY

Durham County Beef Producers formed a County Beef Producers Association Thursday, February 6th. Over 50 producers attended the county meeting in Bethany Town Hall to listen to Mr. Bert Warnica of the Ontario Beef Producers Association.

At the conclusion of this meeting it was decided that an organization was needed. Elected as president was Mr. Wm. Johnson of Bethany; vice pres. Mr. Noray Goheen of Dale, and as secretary, Mr. Art Stewart of Ida. Directors appointed were Mr. Leslie Taylor of Burketon, Mr. Sid Cornish of Hampton, and Mr. Austin Turner of Newcastle. In the chair was Mr. Harvey Malcolm of Yelverton, vice president of the Federation of Agriculture. Secretary, Mr. Clarence Allin of Newcastle explained that while the Federation were sponsors of the meeting, "a farmer was a beef producer first" and it was to be hoped that the new organization would decide to affiliate with the County Federation as soon as possible.

The same evening of Feb. 6 the Federation held their monthly meeting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Will Seymour of Cava with over thirty members present.

A land acquisition committee was named in the persons of the executive. Also a resolution committee was named in the persons of Mr. Mel Staples, Orono; Mr. Clarence Allin Newcastle, and Mr. Dick Bowles, Nestleton.

Report of the various commodity groups were heard and plans for the forthcoming canvass for the Summers memorial fund were discussed. Mr. Garnet Rickard of Bowmanville will be in charge of the canvass.
