

Millbrook Reeve Casts Deciding Vote At Council Meeting

Millbrook, February 3, 1958 —The regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date with the following members of the Council present: Reeve, Geo. H. Harrington, Councillors, Lavern Gibson, Frank North, J. T. Crowley and Gordon Trick.

The minutes of the last regular meeting of the Council were read by the Clerk, also special meeting of January 25th, 1958, and on motion of Councillors Gibson and Crowley were confirmed.

The following communications read:

From The Canadian Mental Health Association, soliciting donations in the interest of the Association.

The Salvation Army, Toronto, seasonal appeal for funds.

Ontario Educational Association, announcing convention, April 7-9, King Edward Hotel, Toronto.

Northumberland and Durham Health Unit, reporting for December.

Brunner Mond Canada Sales, re Calcium Chloride.

Motion by Councillors Crowley and North that communications be received and filed, and that the Clerk be instructed to order eight tons of Calcium Chloride for the Municipality, the same to be picked up at the point of delivery, Amherstburg, Ontario, by Buckham's Transport. Carried.

Mr. George Totten, United Counties roads engineer, was present showing plans of a rigid concrete bridge which he would recommend to replace the wooden structure crossing the creek on Distillery Street, at an estimated cost of \$11,000, including engineering fees. Motion by Councillors North and Gibson that Mr. Totten be given permission to proceed with the building of this bridge, acting as engineer of construction at a fee of 5% the cost price. Carried.

The Reeve read a letter received from Mr. A. R. Willmott regarding the limits and ownership of lots 4 and 5 situated on the south side of King Street, between George and Huston Streets, suggesting that according to a survey made by Mr. Sylvester, land surveyor, the Lunn property be transferred back to lot 5 as formally. Motion by Councillors Trick

and Crowley that the Clerk be instructed to have our Solicitor Mr. Willmott, make this correction as suggested. Carried.

A delegation consisting of J. McMaster, G. E. Liesemer, H. Ouellette and H. Moore, representing the Millbrook Chamber of Commerce, were present suggesting that the Municipality continue its membership with the Lake Ontario Development Association.

Motion by Councillors Trick and Gibson that the Municipality continue membership in the said organization.

The result of the vote: 2 for, 2 against. The Reeve cast a negative vote. Motion declared lost.

Manvers Twp. Council Minutes

Bethany, Ont., Feb. 4, 1958
The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on the above date with all members present, except Councillor Malcolm and Brown who were absent, due to the blocked condition of the roads.

The minutes of the January meeting were read and approved on motion of Jakeman and McGill. Carried.

The following communications were received and read —North, and Durham Health Unit, enclosing the new Provincial regulations regarding slaughter-houses and meat processing plants and the monthly Health Unit report. Zimmerman, Maywood & Turville re the By-Law, granting permission to the Consumers Gas Co. to operate in the Township of Manvers. From the Township of Darlington a copy of their temporary zoning By-Law.

Chipman Chemicals Ltd. enclosing price list of Warble Fly powder for 1958. Tenders were received from Alf Johnson, Bernard Neals and Roblin Equipment for the supplying of a sprayer as per call of tender. Mirror-Reporter re request for an increase in the rate of remuneration for Township Printing. H.E.P.C. several applications for Rural Hydro Service and flat rate water heater service. Brunner, Mond Canada re new price list for Calcium Chloride. Dept. of Municipal Affairs re cheque for the 1957 grant in lieu of taxes and Dept. of Highways, requesting the transfer of certain funds, in connection with the 1957 road account.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Jakeman that \$1200.00 be transferred from road maintenance to roads construction. That \$300.00 be transferred from road maintenance to bridges construction and \$400.00 be transferred from bridges maintenance to bridges construction in connection with the 1957 road account. Carried.

Mr. Roblin of Roblin Equipment and a representative of the Hudson Manufacturing Co. interviewed the Council and explained the features of the spray machine they were offering for sale.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill that the same remuneration be given the printer for the balance of 1958, as in 1957. Carried.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Jakeman that the road By-Law be given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1346. Being a By-Law setting the road appropriation for 1958 at \$32,000.00. No decision was arrived at, on the acceptance of any tender for a sprayer and the matter was left over for the next meeting.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill that the Reeve and Treasurer be authorized to sign cheques for the following accounts:
