

**MILLBROOK BOYS SWEEP RURAL TOURNAMENT**

Last Saturday afternoon 45 boys from Millbrook and district under the supervision of Vince Crough, Joe Thompson, and Elmer Hogg journeyed to Newcastle and returned with 3 cups showing them as Eastern Ontario Champions of the Little N.H.L.
