The simple Gospel's statement, as recorded in John, chapter 14 and 15 states: "Love one another; ye are my friends when ye do whatsoever I require of you." Love is universal—Christian love includes forgiveness, service, and a way of life, response to which is the greatest thing to which boys

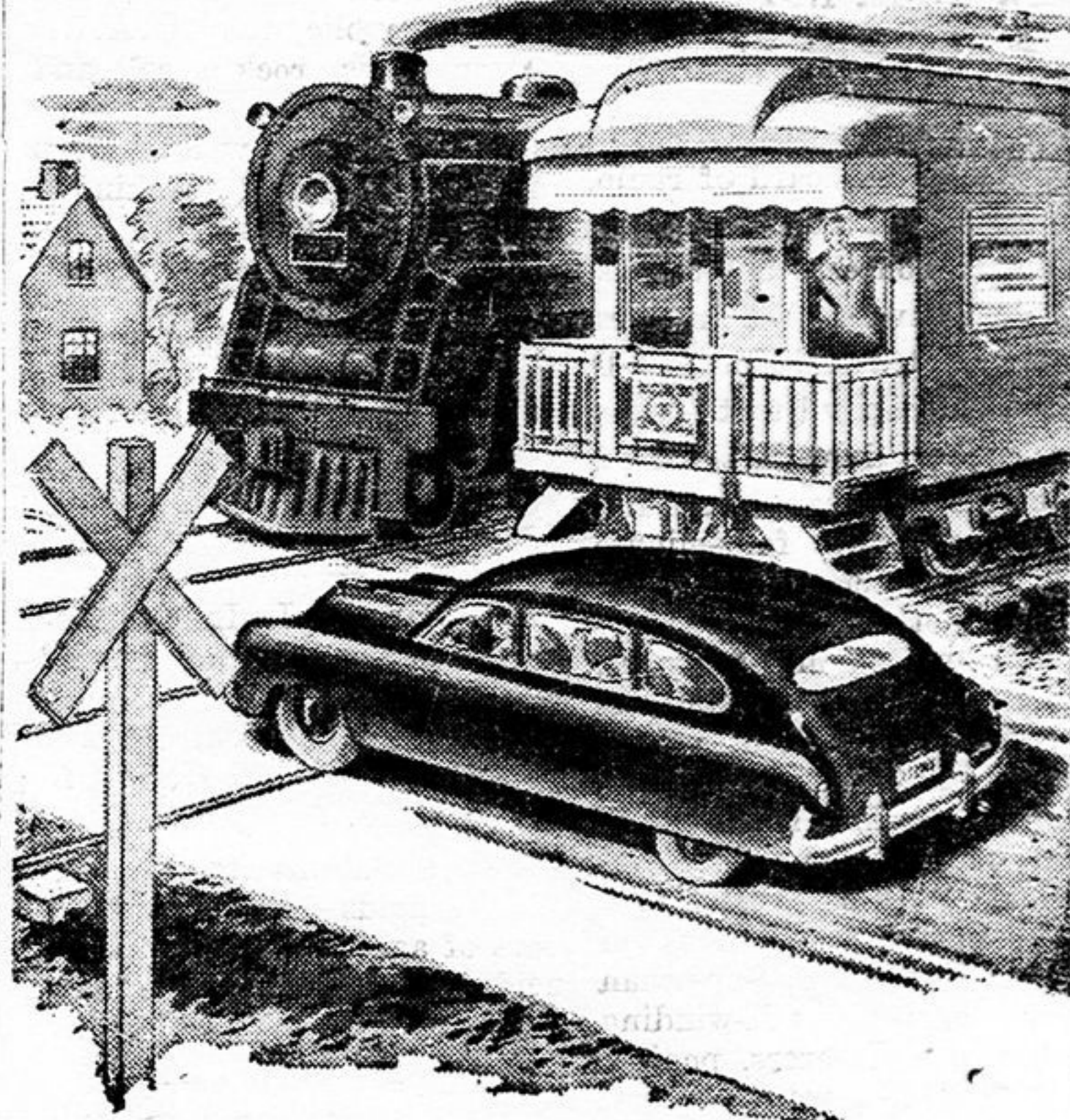
