

Emile Paris Addresses Council

Millbrook, Feb. 2, 1959.—A regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held this date with the following members present: Reeve Geo. F. Harrington, and Councillors L. R. Gibson, C. E. Thornton, Robert Ridge, Vincent Crough.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the Clerk and on motion of Councillors Ridge and Crough were accepted as read.

Mr. Emile Paris was present and addressed the Council making some objection as to the way the Council was dealing with water supply and other matters of finance. Council took no action.

Motion by Councillors Gibson and Thornton that By-law No. 851 re, construction of a new watermain on King St., starting at the intersection of Union and King Streets, proceeding east, be given a third reading. That the Reeve and Clerk be instructed to sign and seal or otherwise complete this By-law. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Ridge and unanimously adopted that the following appointments to the Board of the Millbrook and Cavan Memorial Arena be in effect this year (1959):

Councillor Vincent Crough, representing this Council.

Mr. Frank North, representing Minor Hockey.

Mr. Homer Ouellette interviewed the Council in the interests of the Lions Club re-rental of the Waiting Rooms for their meetings, stating that in future they expected to use the rooms only on the first Monday of each month.

Motion by Councillors Crough and Gibson that the Lions Club be granted the use of the Wait-

ing Room at the rate of \$5.00 per meeting. One regular meeting per month. The first Monday evening being reserved. All special meetings must be reserved in advance. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Crough and Ridge that commencing January 1st, 1959, all labour employed by the Municipality be paid at the rate of \$1.00 per hour. Carried.

The following communications were read:—

From The Department of Highways, enclosing a copy of a By-law to provide for the 1959 expenditures on roads and streets. The Council requested this By-law be held over until next meeting.

From Clerk of the United Counties of Northumberland & Durham, enclosing draught of a By-law to protect the inhabitants and animals of the Municipality against infection from Rabies by licensing and registration of dogs.

The Council decided that By-law No. 817 already in effect in this Municipality, licensing dogs, if strictly enforced should take care of this menace at this time.

From Secretary of the Durham District High School Bd. supplementary balance owing High School Board.

From Department of Transport enclosing a reply to our request for the appointment of an issuer of car and truck licenses here in Millbrook.

From Kerr, McElderry, Howell, Fleming, Bark & Cook, giving notice of a train and car accident at the R.R. crossing on Tupper Street January 22nd, 1959.

From Dept. of Public Works re, sewage disposal.

From The Dept. of Highways, confirming approval of supplementary road expenditure By-law No. 853.

From Ontario School Trustees' and Ratepayers' Association, announcing Convention to be held in Toronto March 30 and 31st.

From Canadian-British Engineer Consultants enclosing Addendum report to the report on sewerage and sewage treatment.

Motion by Councillors Ridge and Crough that communications not otherwise dealt with be received and filed.

From a letter received from the Ontario Telephone Authority regarding an application for approval of rate increase by Durham Telephones Limited, it was moved by Councillors Gibson and Ridge that the Reeve and Clerk forward a letter in support of that decision agreed on by the Council.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Crough that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to complete a By-law setting the amount the Reeve or Council-

lors shall be paid for attendance at regular and special meetings, such By-law to be in effect as of January 1st, 1959, as follows:—

For attendance at regular meetings, Reeve \$6.00 per meeting; Special meetings \$3.00 per meeting. Councillors; Regular meetings \$5.00 per meeting; Special meetings \$3.00 per meeting. Carried.

MASTER SEED POTATO GROWER SELECTED

A "Master Seed Potato Grower" has been selected for the first time in Ontario. He is Clifford Faint, of Morning Mills, Dufferin County, and he received the award at the annual meeting of the Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association just concluded.

The award is presented in recognition of "basic assistance towards furthering the interests of the potato industry". The winner first entered potatoes for seed certification in 1935 from seed purchased from a local grower. Since then he has made seed production a major part of his farm enterprise. In the five-year period 1953-1958 four varieties were grown on the farm: Katahdin, Sebago, Keswick, and Huron. All passed as foundation seed. A tuber unit plot of each variety is maintained for his own seed, and the incidence of disease is kept to a minimum. He has built an up-to-date storage, which not only keeps potatoes in excellent condition, but provides good housing for potato equipment and supplies. An early seed problem was overcome by long-term production methods.

"Clifford Faint's record of quality seed potato production sets an example for all those engaged in the potato industry in Ontario to follow," states R. E. Goodwin, Assistant Director of the Field Crops Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture.
