

### Cavan Council Minutes

Millbrook, Feb. 4th, 1959—Cavan Council met in regular session on above date at 10.30 a.m. in the Council Chamber, all members present, Reeve L. A. Hooton in the Chair.

Minutes of last regular session read, on motion of Councillors Stewart and Farrow were adopted as read. Carried.

The following correspondence read—

Tuberculosis Association, re donation. Russell C. Honey, re donation to Cancer Society. Ontario Association of Rural Municipalities, enclosing receipt for membership. Ontario Municipal Association, enclosing receipt for 1959 membership. L.O.D.A. re dinner meeting at Club Aragon on Feb. 19th, at 6 p.m. Dept. of Agriculture, re Warble Fly Control. International Audit Dept. re arrears assessed on taxes. Durham County District H.S. Board, re supplemental tax roll, and if any monies were owing them. Welfare Administrator, Peterborough, re Gordon Druce and family. Deputy Welfare Commissioner, Hamilton, re Mrs. Lorna Dunlop.

On motion of Deputy Reeve Bradburn and Councillor Farrow above correspondence be received and filed. Clerk answering any not already dealt with. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Stewart that we adjourn to meet at 2 p.m.

2.00 P.M.— Council resumed, all members present. Reeve L. A. Hooton in the Chair.

Mr. A. V. Thorn, collector of rates reported re outstanding taxes, on motion of Deputy Reeve Bradburn and Councillor Burns that report be received, and Collector asked to carry on. Carried.

Mr. Wright of the Consumers Gas Company being present, addressed the meeting re the gas pipe being laid on Concession between 11 and 12 and in front of lots 11 and 12. The Company had trench dug the usual depth, and a letter stating if at any time Township did any work on the hill, they would change the pipes at no cost to the Municipality. The Reeve pointed out to them that they were not to dig same until the Council met and discussed same, and instead they went ahead and dug trench.

On motion of Deputy Reeve Bradburn and Councillor J. Burns that pipe be removed and ditch deepened to a minimum depth of 10 feet and grade established on hill on Concession line between 11 and 12 in front of Lots 11 and 12, re Consumers Gas Company and Township of Cavan. Unanimously carried.

Mr. Lowe of the Consumers Gas Company, addressed the Council re the franchise agreement between the Corporation of the Township of Cavan and the Consumers Gas Company.

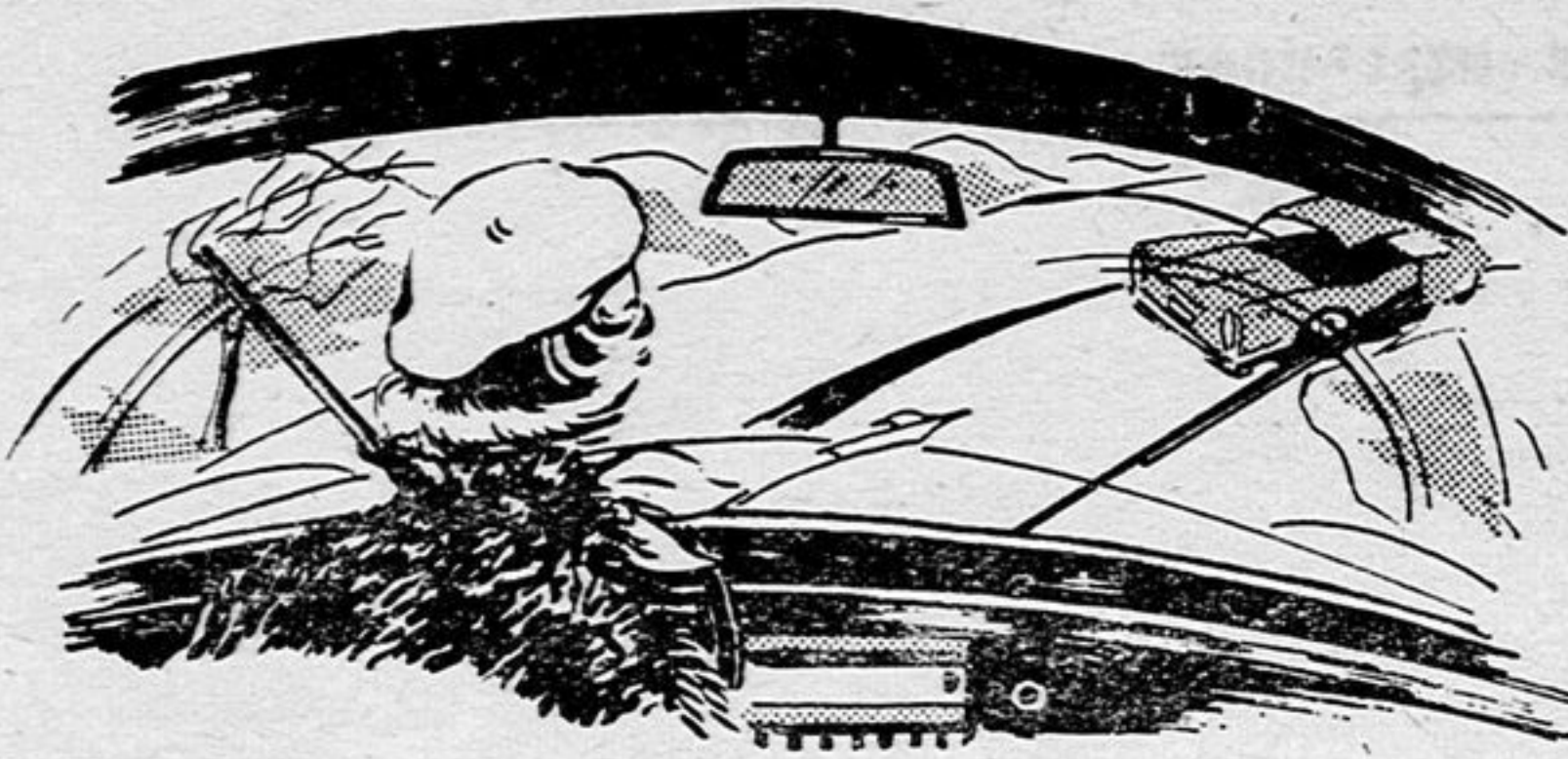
On motion of Councillors Stewart and Farrow that the Clerk introduce By-law.

On motion of Councillor Stewart and Deputy Reeve Bradburn that the Clerk advertise in the Commercial News re tender for maintainer, tenders to be in Clerk's office at 12 p.m. March 11th. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Farrow and Burns that we tender for a sprayer and same be included in tender add for maintainer. Carried.

On motion of Councillor Farrow and Deputy Reeve Bradburn that the Clerk insert tender ad in The Mirror-Reporter re Warble Fly Inspector. Tenders to be in by 1.00 p.m. March 2nd. Carried.

"A good name is rather to be chosen than great richness, and loving favour rather than silver and gold". Proverbs 22:1. "Thou art the captain of thy soul, and the will is a factor of great importance in determining what the outcome in personal accomplishment shall be".

Prayer—"Lord, what a change, one short hour in thy presence can make". "Joy, strength, and courage art with Thee."

Christopher Columbus, Martin Luther, and David Livingstone were given as examples of the kind of Christian character, we can be building every day, for the eye of God to see, and approve.

The senior choir sang anthem "Lord, I believe." The recessional hymn was 483, "He leadeth me, O blessed thought".

### SHAREHOLDERS OF STOCK TOTAL 10,631

More than 99.4% of the shareholders of The Toronto-Dominion Bank took advantage of the Bank's recent offer to purchase additional stock, according to Allen T. Lambert, Vice-President and general manager.

Of the 400,000 shares offered, said Mr. Lambert, only 2,262 remained unsubscribed for when the offer closed on Jan. 15th. The shareholders were offered one additional share for every five shares held.

The stock offer resulted in 1,016 new shareholders being placed on the Bank's Books and the total number of shareholders now stands at 10,631.
