

WILLED HIS EARNINGS AWAY.

A Wife's Charity Was Hard On Her Old

Husband TORONTO, March 13.-That his wife earnings, is what John Lowe substantially said in the Assize Court yesterday. The Home, the Boy's Home and Girl's Home, the legatees, and the Toronto General Trusts' Company the trustees for

John Lowe, the plaintiff, is an old man of 70 years, and resided with his wife until near Syracuse, N.Y. The earnings of his labor as a machinist, first in the Northern Railway shops and after in the T., G. & B. shops, he handed over regularly to his wife, who did the banking business in her own name, depositing the money in the Canada Permanent & Loan Savings Company. 1889 the plaintiff owned two houses on Niagara - street and had had the snug sum of \$5000 in the bank. When the couple removed to the other side the money was transferred to banks in

Mrs. Lowe, who had been adjudged insane by a United States court, returned to Toronto in 1891 without notifying her husband. She entered the Church Home, where she died in August, 1892, leaving a will dated November, 1890, in which the bequests were \$100 to Jane Haughton, \$150 per year to her husband during his lifetime and at the time of his death the remainder to be divided equally among the Girls' Home, Boys' Home and Church Home. In July, 1892, the Supreme Court reversed the decision with reference to Mrs. Lowe's insanity, and the defence urged as evidence the affidavits sworn to at that time by the plaintiff, which stated that his wife was possessed of property and money. The plaintiff contended that his wife had no financial resources, and asked judgment dissolving the bequests and declaring the money his absolutely. His Lordship gave decision in favor of

the plaintiff.
