

Cavan Council Has A Lengthy Meeting

Millbrook, March 6th, 1957.—Cavan Council met in regular session in the Council Chamber Town Hall, Millbrook, on above date at 10.30 a.m., all members present, Reeve L. A. Hooton in the chair.

Minutes of last regular meeting read, on motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Bradburn minutes be adopted as read. Carried.

Minutes of special meeting of Cavan Council held on Feb. 12th. read. A discussion followed re above meeting. Councillors Howden and Cathcart did not understand it was a special meeting of Council. The Reeve had asked the Clerk to call the special Council meeting, which she had done.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn-Deputy Reeve McKnight that minutes be adopted as read. Carried.

1.30 Council Resumed
All members present. A delegation consisting of R. Cathcart, R. Earle, C. Seymour, W. Seymour, W. Bowles, D. Nill, L. Pritchard waited on the Council, re the duties of the Clerk. Mr. Cathcart told the Council he had visited the Clerk's office, and had examined the minutes of several meetings, and made mention that the Clerk refused to show him payroll and vouchers No. 1 and 12 of the roads, also that this delegation were not in favour of motion passed at Council meeting of Feb. 12th.

The Reeve pointed out to the delegation that the payroll and vouchers of the roads were all read out with the Township accounts at the Council meetings and passed, then they were transferred to the road files and the books set up by the Department of Highways. He

also informed delegation in good many Municipalities the road superintendent was the one who kept the road books. The Reeve also informed the delegation the Council were quite in order in motion passed at the February meeting.

Mr. R. Earle thanked the Reeve, Council and Clerk for the time given the delegation. On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Cathcart that this Council has full confidence in Zella M. Bentley in her trustworthy ability as Clerk-Treasurer of the Township of Cavan. Carried unanimously.

Mr. A. V. Thorn collector of rates being present gave his report \$4196.92 had been collected in the month of February in outstanding taxes, and some had been collected to date in March. On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Bradburn report be received and roll extended another month. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Cathcart and Howden that we call for tenders for spraying for Warble Fly, also for inspector for same, tenders to close March 25th. at 12.00 p.m. All tenders to be sent to the Clerk's office. Carried. On motion of Councillor Cathcart and Deputy Reeve McKnight that the Clerk insert an add in issues of March 15 and 22 of the Commercial News, for 5000 cub. yds. or more or equivalent in tonnage of gravel to be crushed and delivered on the Township roads, also price on stock piling gravel at pit, also for sand screened out. Tenders to be in Clerk's office not later than April 1st., 1957 at 12.00 p.m. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Howden and Cathcart that the Road Supt. contact the Road Master of the C.P.R. to make an appointment for the Reeve and Council to meet Con. 8, Lots 6-7 re approach. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Cathcart and Deputy Reeve McKnight that the pay of W. Gillis operator of 99-H be increased 5c per hour. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the pay for the Road Supt. be increased 5c per hour. Carried. The Clerk asked permission

to close the office on March 20 and 21 providing she wished to attend annual meeting of the Canadian Red Cross Society. Permission was granted.

The Road Supt. was instructed to try and arrange a demonstration re chain saws for Saturday, March 9th. Council was to meet at Township garage at 2 p.m.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the Clerk send out the list of invitations as list appears now. Carried.
