### Municipal Shed Planned For By Manvers Council

Bethany, Ont., March 5th, 1957.—The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on the above date, with all members present and Reeve Argue presided. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read, by Malcolm and McGill. Carried. Inquiry from a ratepayer regarding regulations, if any for establishing a fur farm. Department of Municipal Affairs, re change in levying taxes for 1957. Petition from ratepayers of the Eastern part of the second Concession. Township of North York, re a relief matter. The hospital for sick children and Western hospital Toronto, re indigent patient. Dept. of Highways, re sale of property, formerly owned by Mr. H. Demezuk. Dept. of Agriculture, re the 1957 Warble Fly programme. Four new applications for the position of assessor, and others. Accounts were received from the following:—United Counties of N. and D. Toronto Stamp & Stencil Works. Mirror-Reporter. Canadian Statesman. Lindsay Daily Post. The Municipal World. Addison Scott. Herb Neals. HEPC. Four school requisitions. R. R. Edmunds. Messrs. Aubrey Cain, George VanDam and Herman Webb presented a petition to the Council, signed by ratepayers in the area of the eastern part of the 2nd Concession, asking that a hill on the said Concession be improved. Carried. On motion of Malcolm and Brown the road appropriation By-Law for \$32,000.00 was introduced, given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1335. Carried. The Reeve called for the opening of applications for the position of assessor. The following applications were received and read: Wilbert Craig, Leonard Henderson, Wilfred Bird, Ralph Malcolm and the application of W. Elson from a previous ad. Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Brown that the application of Ralph Malcolm be accepted for the position of assessor at a salary of \$1500.00 for 1957. Carried. Moved by Brown, seconded by Jakeman that Council proceed with plans to build a municipal shed; all plans and specifications to be subject to the approval of the Municipal Engineer. Carried. Moved by Jakeman seconded by McGill that the Council meet at the call of the Reeve to view sites for the location of the new Municipal shed and negotiate for same if a suitable location is found. Carried. Mr. D. Gorrie, the Municipal Engineer is to visit the Township in the near future to study the plans for the shed and make any recommendations that he sees fit. Mr. Walter A. Neals was interviewed in connection with the Warble Fly programme. Considerable discussion took place regarding the possibility of securing a spray operator to spray the cattle in the Township as no tenders were received from spray operators and no applications were received for the position of Inspector. On motion of Jakeman and McGill, W. A. Neals was appointed Warble Fly Inspector for the Township of Manvers for 1957 at a rate of \$1.00 per hour and .10c per mile travelling allowance. Carried.
