It seemed fitting that on a Sunday morning, being the Lord's Day, just as the congregation was dismissed with God's blessing, he was called home to the Father's House. "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

W. Fred Fallis, who passed away on February 26th, was a pillar of the Church, as ruling Elder in the Session, and as Superintendent of the Sunday School. Every Sunday morning last year, Fred Fallis stood at the entrance door of St. Andrew's to welcome those who came to worship. Every member of this congregation and every visitor to this Church will remember him: his warm smile, his firm handshake, and his kind word of welcome. He will be of use.
