After a lengthy discussion on the matter Councillor Anderson moved seconded by Councillor Fisher that the petition be tabled until March 18th.

Correspondence received from Salvation Army requesting donation and on motion of R. Fisher seconded by Herb Syer the Treasurer was to prepare cheque for same amount as last year at the next meeting. Clerk of Bewdley requesting a representative of Council at their meeting on March 17th. On motion by George Dean seconded by H. Syer this was accepted and the Clerk asked to notify accordingly. Association of Mayors and Reeves requesting membership fee, and on motion by Geo. Dean seconded by H. Syer, fee was ordered to be paid. Lloyd Metcalfe with cheque for service of grader at Pebee Beach; also a letter from the Northumberland Music Festival Society which was ordered to be sent along to the local school board.

Adjournment was passed on motion of George Dean seconded by Herb Syer, to meet again on April 1st, at 1.00 p.m.

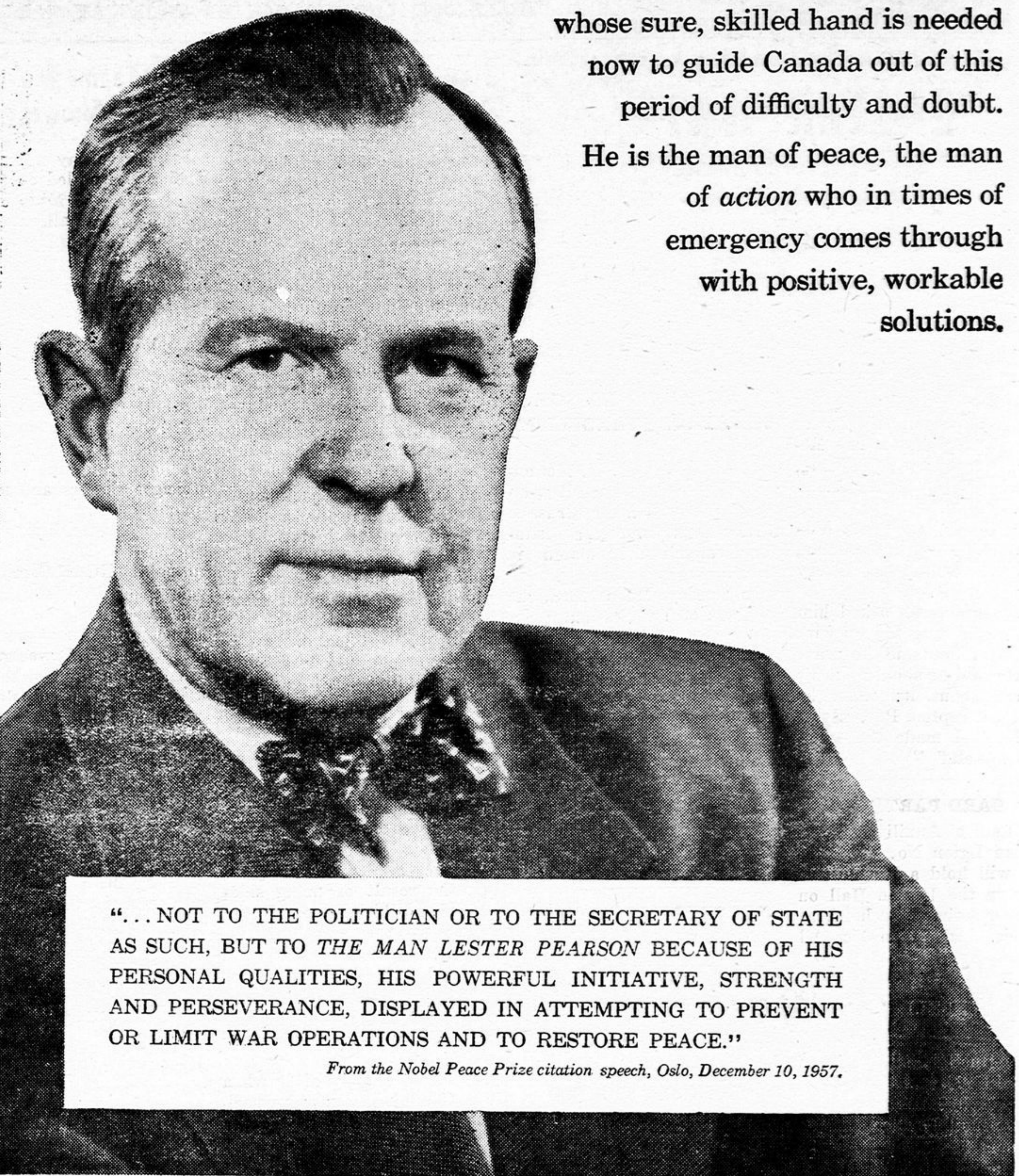

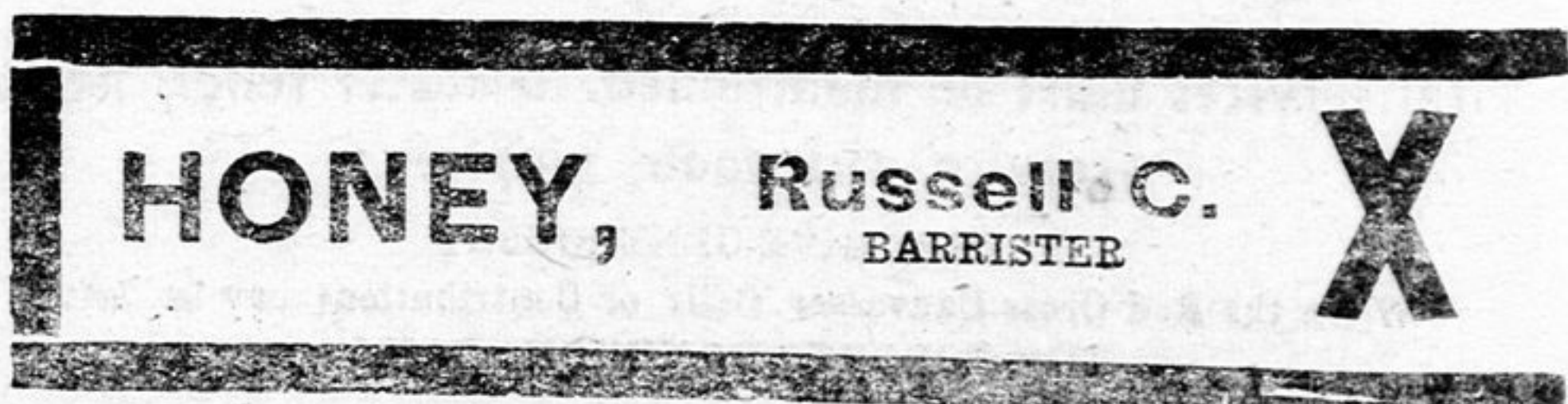
