South Monaghan Council

The regular meeting of the Council of the Township of South Monaghan was held in the Township Hall on March 2, 1959, at 8.00 p.m. with all members present, Reeve Dean in the chair.

Minutes of the previous regular and special meetings were read by the Clerk and adopted on motion by A. G. Anderson seconded by Herb Syer.

Road Superintendent Mr. M. H. Thompson presented voucher No. 2 in the amount of \$1167.71 which was passed for payment on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by Jay Whittington.

A delegation representing the "B B Beach Cottagers Association" waited on the Council regarding the request to Mr. H. F. Wilson to move his cot-

tage farther from the side boundary of his lot. The president of the association Mr. Bino addressed the meeting on this matter and after full discussion and due consideration decided to take no action in the matter.

As it is nearing time for the annual spraying for warble fly, Mr. Harry Larmer was present at the request of the Reeve and after talking this over thorough-

ly Councillor Anderson moved seconded by Jay Whittington that Mr. Larmer be hired for another season as inspector under the "Warble Fly Control Act" at the rate of \$1.25 per hour plus .10c per mile for his car. The Clerk was also asked to place the order for powder with J. P. Plews.

The following correspondence had been received and was presented by the Clerk:

The Board of School Trustees of the School Area of South Monaghan enclosing an invitation to all the Council to attend the formal opening of South Monaghan Consolidated School at Bailieboro on March 5th, 1959.

The Salvation Army with a request for a donation. In this respect a motion by Councillor Whittington seconded by Herb Syer carried that a donation of \$10.00 be made to this worthwhile cause.

Northumberland Music Festival Society requesting a grant. This was ordered to be sent along to the School Area Board of Trustees.

Application for bounty on two foxes from Mr. I. Muskrat which the Clerk was asked to look after.

Chipman Chemical Co. enclosing price list of warble fly powder; this was ordered to be filed.

Two letters from J. L. Graham Co. regarding registration of debentures, this had been dispensed with by the Clerk.

Mr. Lloyd Metcalf requesting permission for an interview with representatives of the "B B Beach Cottagers Association," this was granted.

Department of Agriculture, Live Stock Branch enclosing a summary of the survey of live stock losses for the Province of Ontario for 1958. Filed.

Lake Ontario Development Association advising of dinner meeting and extending an invitation to attend. Filed.

Association of Ont. Mayors and Reeves enclosing application forms for membership and information concerning convention. Filed.

Northumberland and Durham Health Unit, report for Jan. and also requesting the Municipality to pass a by-law making compulsory the licensing of nursing homes. No action was taken.

Hydro-Electric with one contract which was approved.

J. L. Graham Co. with statement of debentures received and also enclosing cheque in the amount of \$40,093.08 which finalizes the sale of the debentures for the construction of the school addition.

M. H. Thompson the Road Superintendent enclosing his resignation from that position, to become effective at the end of March. This was accepted with regret on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by A. G. Anderson. In this respect the Clerk was asked to place an advertisement in the Peterborough Examiner for applications for this position.

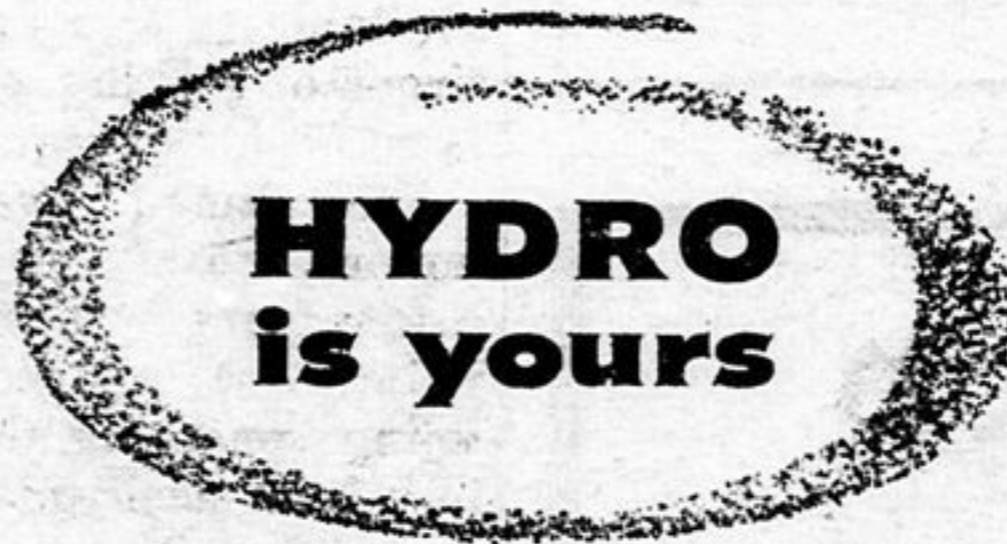
