

Manvers Township Council

Bethany, Ont., March 3, 1959. The regular Council meeting (monthly) was held on above date, with all members present and Reeve Argue presided over the meeting.

The minutes of the February meeting were read and approved on motion of McGill and Malcolm. Carried.

The following communications were received and read: Dept. of Highways re the turning back of the old sections of No. 35 Highway not in use at the present time to the Township road system. Two applications for the position of Warble Fly Inspector for 1959. Chipman Chemicals Ltd. re the new price list of Warble Fly Powder. Ryley & Son tender re Township warble fly requirements

for 1959. N. and D. Health Unit monthly report. Dept. of Municipal Affairs re subsidy in lieu of taxes on City lands in the amount of \$163.58 for 1958. Toronto Daily Star, advising that road signs are not being given out at the present time. United Counties Clerk re two indigent patients in hospital. Lake Ontario Development Association re meeting in Peterborough on Feb. 19, 1959. The Association of Ontario Mayors and Reeves soliciting 1959 membership. The minutes of the Ganaraska R.C.A., held on Feb. 13, 1959. Five school requisitions and several accounts.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Brown, that \$1400.00 be transferred from bridge construction to road construction re the 1958 road account. Carried.

Moved by Malcolm, seconded by Brown that the 1959 warble fly powder supplies be ordered from Ryley & Son at tendered price. Carried.

Two applications were received for the position of Warble Fly Inspector and one application for the supplying of transportation for the Township trailer sprayer unit. Cecil Bulmer and Harry Shea for the Inspectors and Cecil Bulmer for supplying the transportation required.

On motion of McGill and Brown the application of Cecil Bulmer for Warble Fly Inspector and the application for supplying transportation was accepted; the rate of pay to be \$2.40 per hour for both jobs. Carried.

On motion of Malcolm and Jakeman, the application of Harry Shea for Warble Fly Inspector for 1959 was accepted and the rate of pay to be \$1.20 per hour and .10c per mile automobile allowance when necessary to provide own transportation. Carried.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm that a new 15 inch carriage, Underwood Type-writer be purchased at a net price of \$194.50 delivered.

On motions of Brown and McGill, the 1959 road By-Law for \$32,000.00 was given the three necessary readings, passed, signed, sealed and numbered 1359. Carried.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill that Councillors and Clerk attending the conventions for two days receive \$25. allowance and for attending one day \$12.50 allowance. Carried.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill, that the C.P.R. be contacted re the matter of the section-men depositing snow on the sidewalk in Bethany when shovelling a road into the station and the matter of not keeping the railway crossings in a smooth condition for traffic. Carried.

A lengthy discussion took Highway turning back the old Highways turning back the old sections of No. 35 highway not in use at the present time. The Council are of the opinion that section going through Pontypool should be re-surfaced; other sections in need of repair should be fixed up before turning them back and the bridge over Pigeon creep checked to see if it is sound. The Clerk was instructed to write a letter to the Dept. of Highways to this effect.

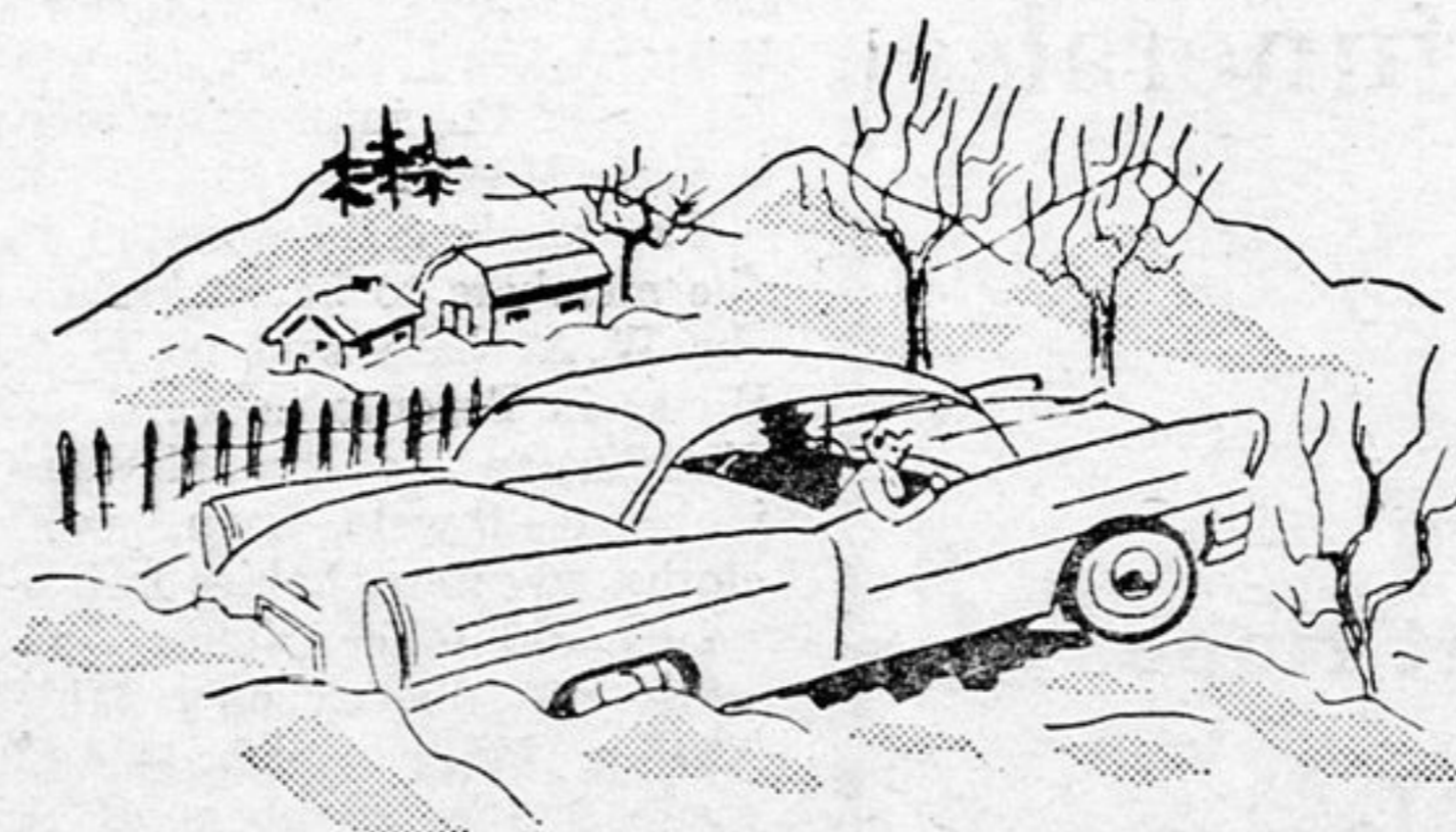
