

Cavan Council

Millbrook, April 1st, 1957.—Cavan Council met on above date in regular session at 10.30 a.m. in the council chamber, all members present, Reeve L. A. Hooton in the Chair.

Minutes of last regular meeting read, on motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Bradburn that minutes be adopted as read. Carried.

Minutes of special meeting read, on motion of Councillors Howden and Cathcart that minutes be adopted as read. Carried.

Allen Martin addressed the Council re the position of helper on the spraying outfit with the Don La Fonte Construction for the Warble Fly control.

On motion of Councillors Howden and Bradburn that Allen Martin be engaged as helper with Don La Fonte for the Warble Fly Spray. Carried.

On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Cathcart that the Clerk be instructed to register above list of arrears of taxes as recommended by Collector of rates. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the Collector's report be received and Collector asked to carry on and try and collect outstanding taxes. Carried.

A delegation consisting of Mr. A. Stewart and M. Magee waited on the Council re the cutting down of hill on the 12th Concession opposite Rae Stewart's gate. The Reeve informed them when on Road inspection the Council as a whole would inspect same.

Mr. D. Gorrie the District Engineer being present, there was a motion by Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the Clerk open the tenders for gravel.

The following tenders were opened:

From—R. A. Blythe Company, crushing and delivering on roads 6 mile haul per cubic yard .71c plus an additional .07c per cubic yard per mile over 6 mile haul, or fraction thereof. Crushing and stockpiling in pit per cubic yd .46c. Crushing off the belt per cubic yd. 39c. Stockpiling excess sand taken from crusher stockpiled in pit, per cubic yd. 25c.

Frank S. Coyle Ltd.—Crushing and delivering on roads 6 mile haul per cubic yd. 73c, plus an additional 8c per cubic yd. per mile, over 6 mile. Crushing and stockpiling in pit per cubic yd. 56c. Crushing and delivering up to 6 mile haul per ton 68c, plus an additional 7c per ton per mile over 6 miles. Stockpiling in pit per ton 50c. Stockpiling excess sand, from crusher in pit, per yd. 41c. Stockpiling excess sand, from crusher in pit, per ton 38c.

Leo Gangee—Crushing and delivering on roads 6 mile haul, per yd. \$1.83 plus 10c a yard mile over 6 mile haul. Crush and stockpile in pit, per yard \$1.33.

On motion of Councillor Cathcart and Deputy Reeve McKnight that we accept the tender of the R. A. Blythe Company, to crush and deliver gravel on the Township roads up to 6 mile haul, at a price of 71c per cubic yard plus an additional charge of 7c per cubic yd. per mile, or fraction of a mile beyond the 6 mile limit, also to be written in contract that they crush over 5000 yds. if needed. Also if any of the farmers wished their lanes gravelled that the R. A. Blythe Company do same before they pull out of pit, and the R. A. Blythe Co. pay owner of pit for gravel used; and they collect from the farmer for any lanes they gravel. Carried.

Mr. Cronin of the Taylor Safe Co. addressed the Council

re office safe, explaining to Council that the safe was over 50 years old, and was not fire proof. He left cuts and prices of new safes with the Clerk, for future reference.

Mr. W. L. Elson addressed the Council re the salaries that assessors were getting in other Townships surrounding, and he would leave it with the Council re an increase in salary.

Council reported re the demonstration of the chain saw.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the road superintendent be instructed to buy chain saw from Frank B. Hemming. Carried.

Considerable discussion took place re increase in pay re the Township employees.

On motion of Councillor Cathcart and Deputy Reeve McKnight that the Assessor's salary be increased \$100.00 per year. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Howden that the collector of rates be increased by \$25.00 per year. Carried.

On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Howden that the treasurer's salary be increased \$100.00 per year. Carried.

Council pay to be \$5.00 per each meeting.

On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Bradburn that the pay for men on the Township roads be adjusted as follows, effective May 1st. Pay for day labour be \$1.00 per hour. Man and team,

\$1.75 per hour. Man and tractor \$2.00 per hour.

Councillors Cathcart and Howden moved an amendment that effective April 1st the pay for day labour be \$90c per hour. Man and team \$1.75 per hour. Man and tractor \$2.00 per hour.

Amendment carried.

On motion of Councillors Bradburn and Deputy Reeve McKnight, that the Clerk introduce certain By-Laws:

The Clerk introduced a By-Law re rate of pay road supt., and By-Law for road expenditures for 1957.

On motion of Councillors Howden and Cathcart that we go into committee of the whole for second reading with blanks filled in.

Committee rose on motion and resumed, on motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Bradburn.

On motion of Councillors Howden and Bradburn that By-Laws be read a third time, signed, sealed and numbered 975 and 976. Carried.

On motion of Deputy Reeve McKnight and Councillor Howden that this Council go on record as objecting to the lifting of the C.N.R. from Millbrook to Peterborough, due to it being detrimental to the Municipality in the future. Carried.
