

Vimy Memorial Dinner

About 85 Millbrook and District veterans attended the Vimy Memorial Dinner held in the local Legion Hall. An excellent turkey dinner was served by the Legion's Women's Auxiliary. After welcoming the guests President George Howden called upon Major L. J. Stuart to introduce the speaker—Col. J. A. Dewart, M.C., E.S. Col. Dewart, bridging the gap of 40 years since April 9th, 1917, called on his personal memory of the capture of Vimy Ridge to paint a very vivid picture of the attack, in which the Canadian Corps defeated the most highly trained professional soldiers in the world—the German Army. "The Canadians, in contrast, were not professional soldiers 'enraged civilians' who never knew what it was to retreat. They never had to give back a yard of ground that they had taken". In fact, part of the Ridge has been ceded in perpetuity to Canada, by the French nation.

"Vivid and swift the years like rivers flow:
Their changing seasons rise and shift and wane,
But still the glory and the lasting glow
Of valour and those epic days remain.

They will remember Vimy while life last,
Though years have thinned those bold and valiant ranks,
And we who knew the victory long past,

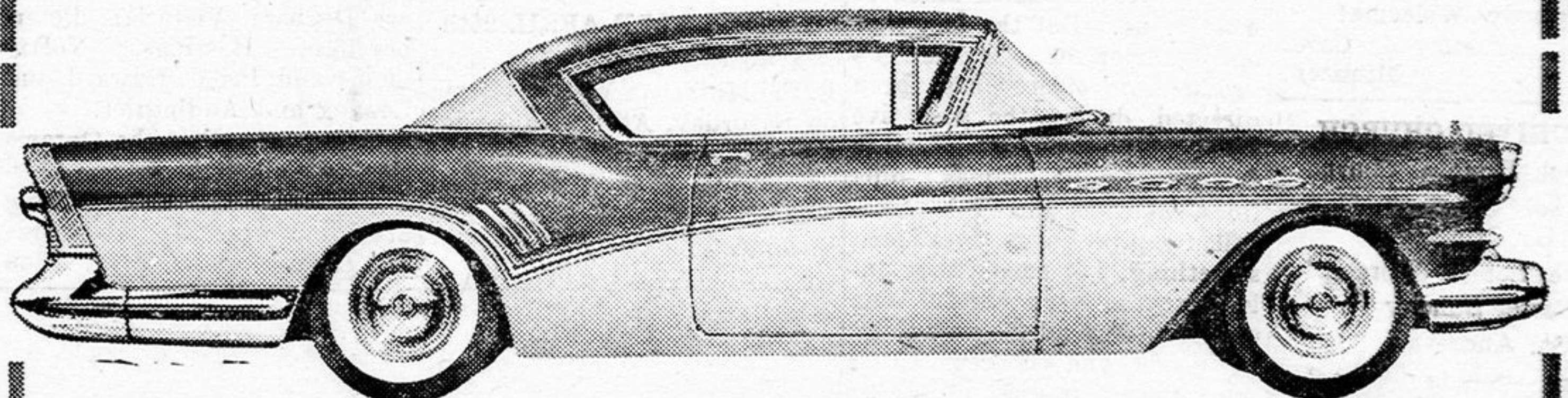
