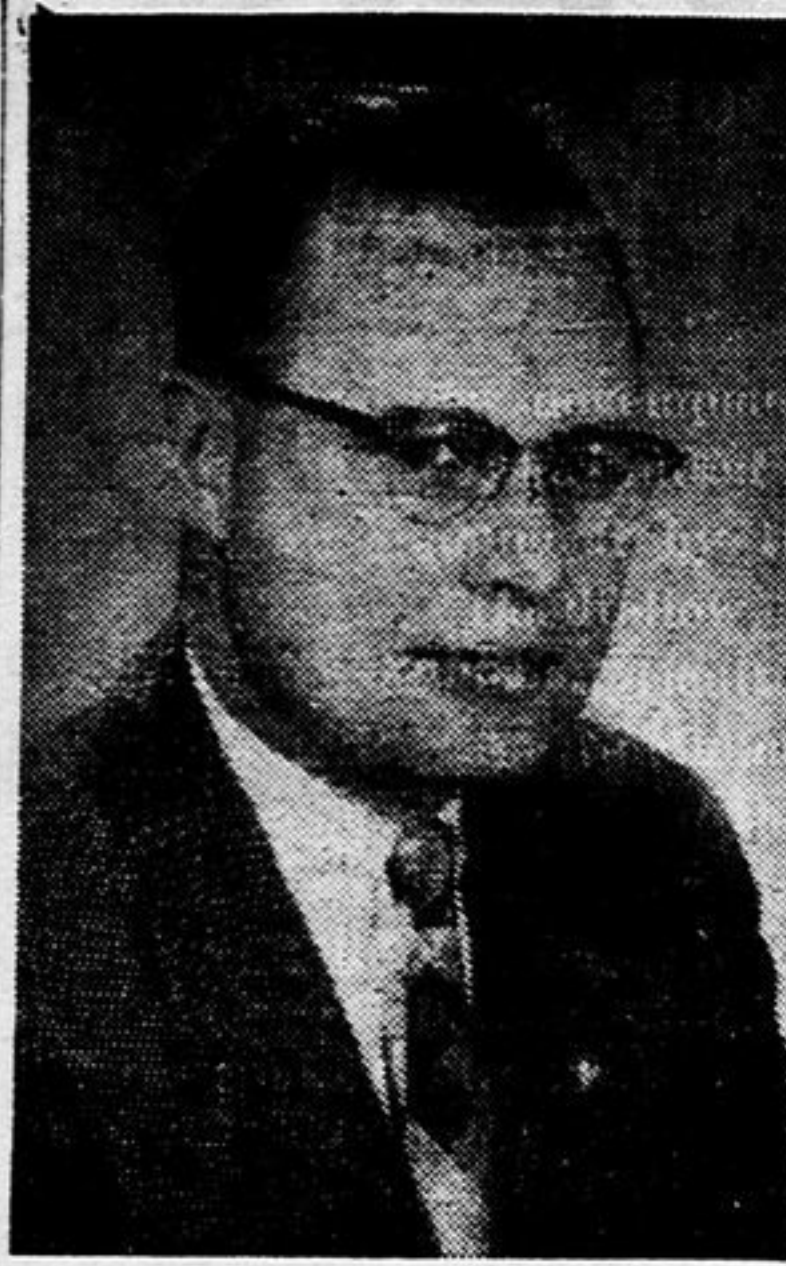


10th Anniversary Observed By The Lions Club

A Tribute

It is with deep gratitude to Almighty God that we review record the career of one who spent a life-time in the service of Jesus Christ and of His Church. The Reverend Herman McConnell, B.A., a member of Victoria Presbytery, B.C. and an Elder of St. Andrew's United Church, Millbrook.

A native of Springbrook, Ontario, Mr. McConnell was a student minister in Saskatchewan before entering Wesley College, Winnipeg. It was then that he earned the title of "the Bishop of the Soo line," a nickname handed him as the first ordained minister between Moose Jaw and Portal on the U.S. border.

He worked in Saskatchewan until his retirement in 1939, when he moved first to Regina and then to Cape Mudge Indian Mission near Campbell River, B.C. At the age of 73, he volunteered to do war work and spent three and a half years in a shipyard at Victoria.

Since coming with his wife to stay at the home of their daughter, Mrs. Bruce Ingham, he endeared himself to the hearts of many, visiting sick and shut-in neighbours. He maintained a deep interest in the Church. As long as he was able, he was a regular attendee at St. Andrew's of which he was a member of Session.

A man of many talents, Mr. McConnell had a deep love of music. Much of his time latterly was devoted to writing poetry, some of his verses being set to music.

It is with tender sympathy that we remember his widow and his daughter, and commend them to the comfort and consolation of Christ.

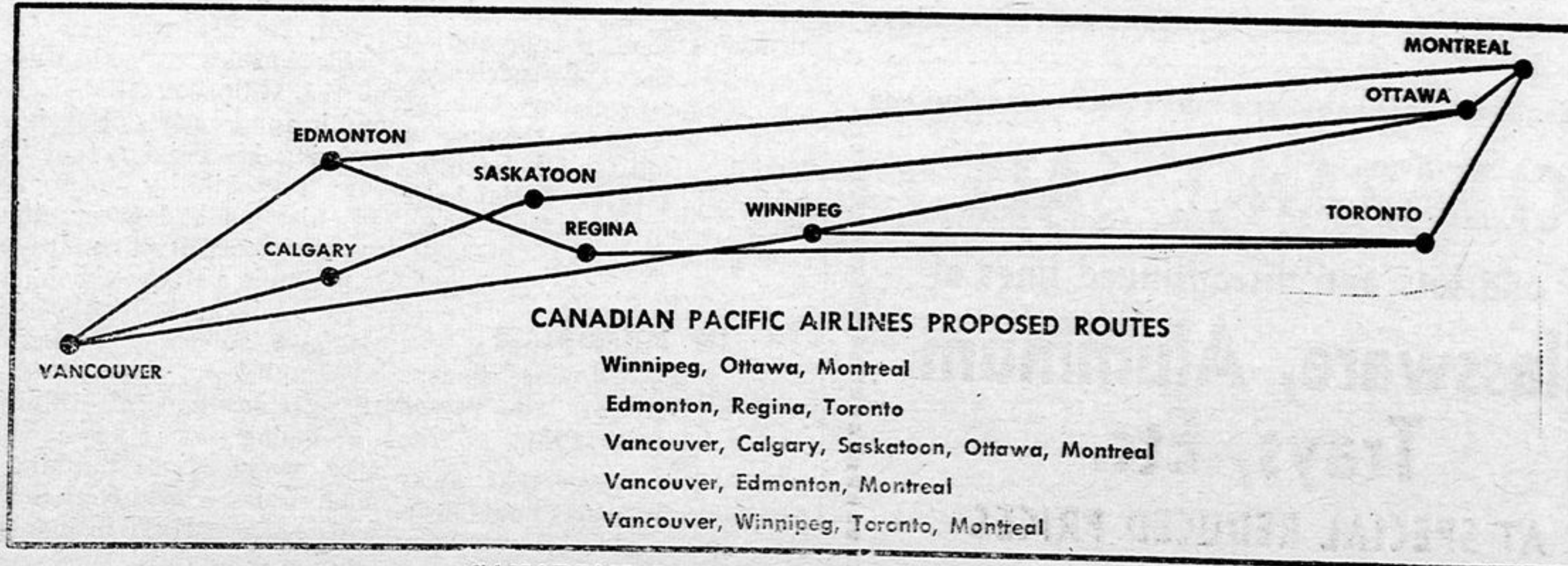

CANADIAN PACIFIC PROPOSES AIR ROUTES

The above drawing shows how nine major Canadian cities will benefit from improved air service if an application by Canadian Pacific Airlines now before the Air Transport Board is approved. Daily service is proposed on five east-west mainline routes, providing for the first time non-stop service between the following cities: Montreal-Edmonton; Toronto-

Regina; Ottawa-Winnipeg; Ottawa-Saskatoon; Regina-Edmonton; and the first service linking Saskatoon and Vancouver via Calgary.

Warden Bothwell Honoured

Five new development grants for the United Counties were announced by the W. A. Goodfellow, Minister of agriculture M.P.P. for Northumberland Wednesday night at the warden's dinner held in honor of United Counties Warden Bothwell at the Millbrook Courtesies.

The dinner, which was arranged by the Clerk and Council of South Monaghan Township, of which Mr. Bothwell was reeve, was attended by 400 people, including members of the counties' council and their wives. Deputy Michael Wladyka, of Post Office, was master of ceremonies.

Mr. Goodfellow congratulated the United Counties on their proposed improved programme for care of the aged. He said the counties' award of their responsibilities in providing good roads could be noted by driving through the area. He did not elaborate on the new grants.

The Minister said South Monaghan was to be congratulated for being able to produce a warden who could qualify as a warden at such close intervals. Harry Campbell, a former warden of South Monaghan, who had served as warden in 1952.

Mr. Goodfellow conveyed the guests the regret of Mr. John Foote, V.C., M.P.P. Durham, that he could not attend the banquet.

A tribute to the Dominion and Provincial parliaments voiced by David Dingwall, reeve of Cramahe Township, who proposed a toast to the parliaments of Canada.

Mr. Dingwall said the government of Ontario had made a great contribution to the welfare of the people and mentioned as examples the provincial efforts to expand the trade, the work of the department of agriculture and expanding highway system.

The Cramahe reeve enthusiastically of the Dominion parliament and it had shown its interest in county's older citizens by increasing the old age pensions.
