## More Talk About High School Situation

Durham County High School District Board, despite a 6 1-2-hour meeting, is no nearer a solution to its dilemma of where to build a new High School in the county yet satisfy the conflicting interests of three municipalities.

The board met in committee in Bowmanville to draft a reply to a series of questions posed by Newcastle in an open letter in which Newcastle's claim to the new High School in preference to the board's choice of Orono were elaborated.

After working half way through the list it was decided at 1.30 a.m. to defer further discussion to a subsequent meeting.

Other discontented elements are the ratepayers of Darlington, Durham's most densely populated Township, and also Millbrook residents, who face losing their High School when the new school is built.

The problem is likely to assume sedious proportions unless an agreement can be worked out. Bowmanville High School in spite of a recent addition being built on to it, is expected to have more than 750 pupils in the next school year and 950 by 1960.

The majority of the influx is reckoned to be from Darlington.

The board will meet again at a date to be fixed in an attempt to draft a statement explaining its reasons for adhering to the decision to make Orono the site for the New High School. Examiner.
