Prayer Pays Off On Wall St.

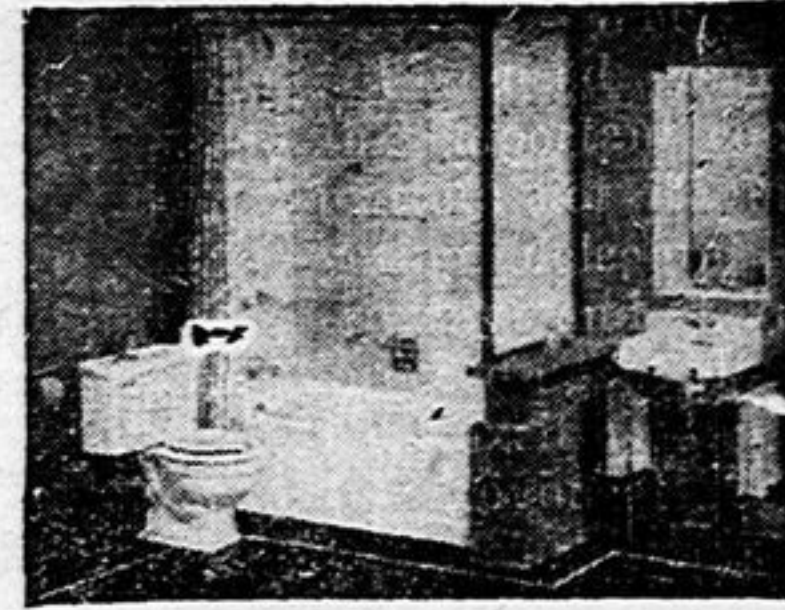

As in my previous item in our paper, I again remind you, that this board's decision, written, oral or otherwise, are only for its own duration and they cannot commit future boards.

If this board is sincere in its efforts to help the Millbrook School Area, I would suggest that it publicly submit a plan for a 250 pupil High School Millbrook and also set up a committee to locate and purchase a suitable site for an area where by this school would be ready for use in 2 years sooner from this date.
