Daylight Saving Starts In Millbrook Sunday, April 27

Millbrook, April 7, 1958.—The regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date with the following members present: Reeve Geo. F. Harrington, Councillors Lavern Gibson, Frank North, J. T. Crowley and Gordon Trick.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the Clerk and on motion of Councillors Trick and Gibson were confirmed.

The following communications were read:

Motion by Councillors North and Crowley that communications not otherwise dealt with be received and filed.

Mr. Reg. Hopkins and Mr. Ivan L. H. Gray were present and addressed the Council re the High School situation as it effects Millbrook. Councillor North draughted a letter which was adopted by the Council, to be forwarded to the High School Board, further outlining the position of this Council regarding new buildings and school areas.

Motion by Councillors Gibson and Trick that Daylight Saving Time (one hour advance), be in effect in this Municipality commencing April 27th, 1958, at the hour of 1 a.m. to October 26th, 1958.

Motion by Councillors Crowley and Trick that this Council go on record as not being in favour of the Extension of the Municipal Franchise, as stated in Bill No. 160, 1958.

Motion by Councillors Gibson and Crowley that the salary of Chief of Police, Street Foreman, Weed Inspector and Caretaker of Town Hall and Fire Hall, Clifford Scott, be increased by two hundred dollars per year, the same to be in effect as of January 1st, 1958. Carried.
