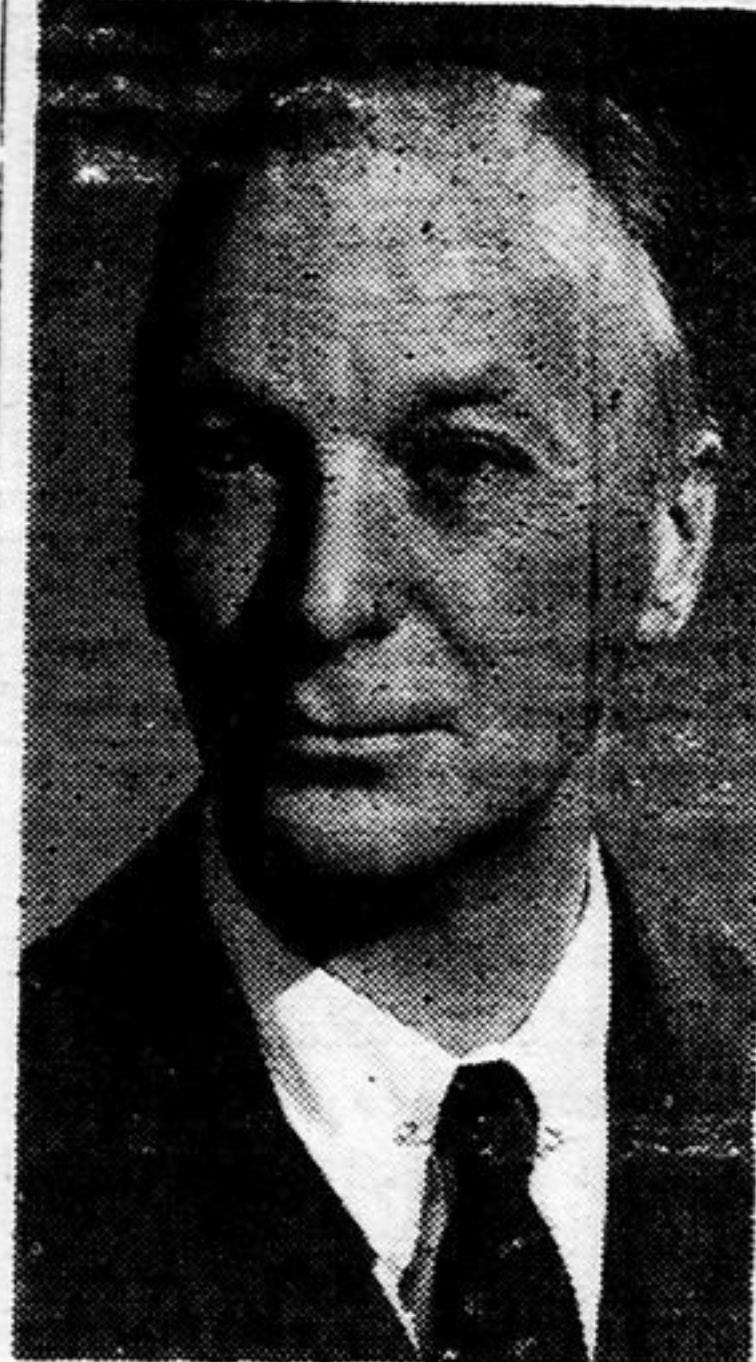
FIRES LAST WEEK KEEP FIREMEN BUSY
