more than these?"
He saith unto Him, "Yea,
Lord, Thou knowest that I love
Thee". Jesus saith unto him,
"Feed my lambs".

The first resurrection joy
was over and Jesus' promise
was "I go before you into
Galilee," where seven of apos-
tles went. Things were very
uncertain, so Simon Peter saith
unto them, "I go a fishing",
John 21:3, and they all went
forth, and entered into a ship
immediately; and that night
they caught nothing.

But when the morning was
come, Jesus stood on the shore
(but they knew not that it was
Jesus,) and said unto them
cast the net on the right side
of the ship, and ye shall find.
They cast therefore, and drew
in a miraculous draught of
fishes. John saith unto Peter
"It is the Lord".

Peter immediately swam a-
shore, and the others came in
a little ship dragging the net
with great fishes, 153. Jesus
had a fire of coals ready, and
fish laid thereon, and bread,
and with the new catch, they
had an abundant breakfast. And
when they had eaten, Jesus saith
unto Simon Peter, "Simon, son
of Jonas, lovest thou me more
than these?" Peter answered,
"Yea, Lord, Thou knowest that
I love Thee". A second and
third time Jesus asks Peter the
same question "Lovest thou
me?" Remembering how Peter
had thrice denied Him, John
18:17-25 and 27. Peter was
grieved because Jesus said unto
him the third time, "Lovest
thou me?" and Peter said unto
Jesus, "Lord, Thou knowest all
things; Thou knowest that I
love Thee."

Jesus saith unto Peter, "Feed
my sheep".
So in the presence of the
"Inner Circle of the Apostles,
Peter is restored to his Apostleship",
and commissioned to
carry the Gospel to Rome.

we sincerely reply "Lord, Thou
knowest all things; Thou knowest
that I love Thee".

Army.

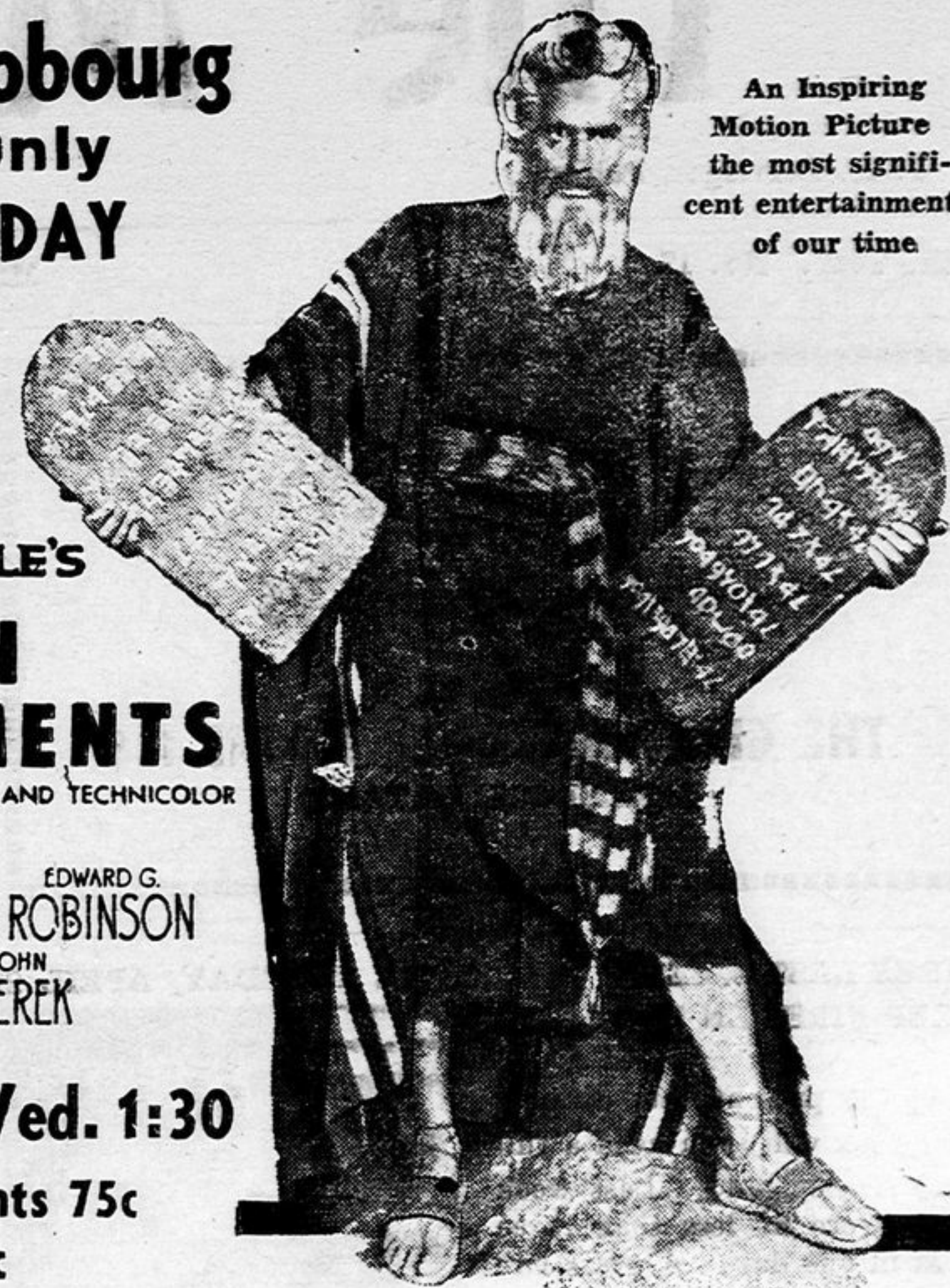

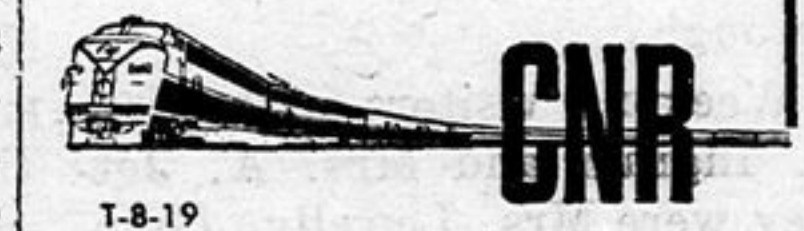

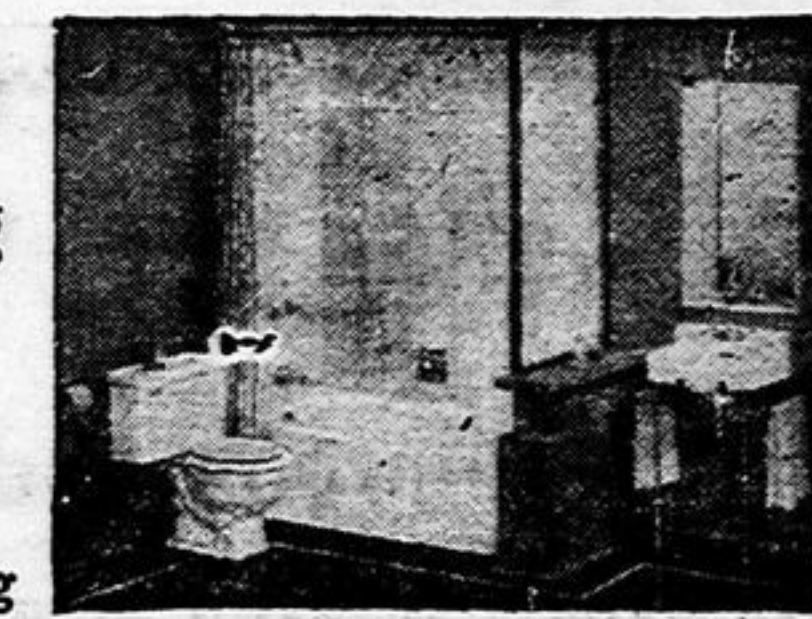
