Millbrook Village Council

Millbrook, April 6, 1959.—The regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date. Members present as follows—

Reeve—Geo. F. Harrington. Councillors—Lavern Gibson, C. E. Thornton, Vincent Crough and Robert Ridge.

Minutes of the last regular meeting of March 2nd, and Special meetings of March 3, 4, and 30 were read by the Clerk and on motion of Councillors Crough and Gibson were confirmed as read.

Mr. J. O. Craig, Lot 12-13 W.S. Tupper St. and Mr. H. Williamson, Lot 3 N.S. King and Ray Nelson, Lot 4 N.S. King St., were present to interview the Council re draining problems respecting their properties.

The Reeve explained that the responsibility of the Municipality in this respect, was much the same as between private properties, and it is not responsible for the disposal of water from basements and cellars of private properties, even to the extent of lowering the ditches to accommodate same. However he did promise that the Council would do what they could to correct this condition.

Motion by Councillors Gibson and Thornton that the Millbrook Agricultural Society be given a grant of \$50.00 for this year 1959.

The Durham District High School Board submitted a resolution for the approval of the Council for the issue of debentures in an amount estimated

to be \$1,300,000.00 repayable over a period of 20 years, to provide for cost of constructing a 400 pupil school in the Township of Darlington, a 400 pupil school in the Township of Clarke and a 150 pupil school in the Village of Millbrook.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Crough that this Council approves of this entire resolution as submitted and that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to complete and forward as instructed. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Crough and Ridge that owing to complaints being received from time to time, the Clerk be instructed to write the Fire Marshal of Ontario and request that he come to Millbrook and investigate some of these claims and make recommendations that would eliminate such fire hazards. Carried.

As arranged at a joint meeting of the Councils of the Township of Cavan and the Village of Millbrook March 30, a five year lease agreement regarding occupancy of the Town Hall, was read by the Clerk.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Ridge that this lease agreement as submitted be adopted and that the Reeve and Clerk be instructed to complete same. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Crough and Gibson that Mr. H. Bremner be granted \$5.00 for water supplied from his well for the Millbrook waiting rooms during this year 1959.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Ridge that the Streets Supervisor be instructed to

instal a culvert in the driveway of Mr. H. Williamson, Lot 3, N.S. King Street. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Ridge and Gibson that the Clerk be instructed to notify those concerned, by registered mail, that the areas covered by the Millbrook Fire Department is strictly confined within the Corporate limits, The Village of Millbrook. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Ridge and Gibson that membership in the amount of \$10.00 for the year 1959, be paid Association of Ontario Mayors and Reeves and that the Reeve and Councillor Thornton be appointed to attend the annual convention to be held in the City of St. Catharines May 6, 7 and 8th. Carried.

Motion by Councillors Thornton and Crough that the application of Mrs. Gertrude Dawe, for the position of clerk, treasurer and tax collector for the Village, be accepted at the agreed salary of \$1200.00 per year, commencing April 15th, 1959. Carried.

The Reeve and Clerk be authorized to complete the necessary By-law.

The following communications were read by the Clerk—From the Township of Cavan, completed contract for fire protection in the Township with the Village of Millbrook. R. J. Dilling, municipal auditor for the Village. Auditor's report for the year 1958, including Millbrook Public School, Millbrook Public Utilities, Library and Millbrook and Cavan Memorial Arena. The Northumberland and Durham Health Unit enclosing annual report for the year 1958. The Association of professional engineers of Ontario, re Arena inspection. The Department of Highways of Ontario, cheque enclosed in the amount of \$3,375.06, balance subsidy on streets for the year 1958. The Ontario Good Roads Association re School of Road Superintendents to be held May 11 and 12. The Pedler People Limited, price lists. Fire Marshall Office, re training course for Municipal Chiefs April 22-24th, 1959. The Office of the Minister of Planning and Development, re Civil Defence.

Motion by Councillors Gibson and Crough that Daylight Saving (one hour advance of standard time) be in effect in the Village commencing April 26th at the hour of 1.00 a.m. to October 25th, 1959. Carried.

Mr. Ronald Palmer representing the Lions Club, also the Lady Lions, was present requesting the Council's permission to do some decorating in the Millbrook Waiting Rooms. It was agreed by the Council that they proceed with their plans. 1/4 cup of sugar,
1-3 cup frozen tangerine concentrate, (1/2 of a 6 oz. tin)
1 egg white.

Soak gelatine in the cold water. Add boiling water, sugar, lemon juice and tangerine juice. Stir thoroughly, cool in fridge till as thick as unbeaten egg whites, then beat till frothy and light in colour. Beat egg white till it stands in peaks, mix in tangerine mixture gently. Pour into a 1 quart mould or 6 dessert dishes. Chill for an hour or until firm.
