

### Cavan Township Council Session

Millbrook, April 3rd, 1959.—Cavan Council met in regular session on above date at 1 p.m. in the Council Chamber, all members present, Reeve L. A. Hooton in the Chair.

Minutes of March 4 meeting read and on motion of Deputy Reeve Braburn and Councillor Farrow that minutes be adopted as read.

Minutes of special meetings of March 11th and 30th read, on motion of Councillors Burns and Stewart that the minutes of the two special meetings be adopted as read. Carried.

Mr. Stockley, representative from the Dept. of Health, Province of Ontario, addressed the Council re a Clinic which was to be set up in Millbrook and Cavan about June 22-23rd. re Tuberculosis tests, and wished the co-operation of the Councils in the two Municipalities, in

helping to get same setup. The different members of Council were to contact the different Church organizations in their division re the organizing same.

Mr. Swartze also addressed the Council re a gravel run which he had on his farm, and would be glad to sell the Township gravel for roads. The Reeve informed Mr. Swartze when Council were on road inspection they would call and see same.

Mr. A. V. Thorn, collector of rates gave his report to the end of March 1959, and recommended a number to be registered.

On motion of Deputy Reeve Braburn and Councillor Burns that the collector's report be received, and Clerk instructed to register list of arrears of taxes as recommended by the collector of rates, and collector asked to carry on and try and collect the outstanding taxes. Carried.

On motion of Deputy Reeve Braburn and Councillor Stewart the Clerk was instructed to write Ontario Hydro Commission to notify them that the Township of Cavan will not be responsible for power for said lot 24, con. 14.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Farrow that we pay the \$3.00 registration fee, and send Mr. Harry Tully road superintendent to the two day course for road superintendents which is being held at the University of Toronto, and being put on by the Dept. of Highways of Ontario.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Farrow that this Council endorse the resolution giving tentative approval to the Durham County District H.S. Board for issuing debentures to amount of \$1,300,000.00 for the building of a 400 pupil school in Darlington, a 400 pupil school in Clarke and a 150 pupil school in Millbrook. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Stewart and Farrow that above correspondence be received and filed, the Clerk answering any not already dealt with. Carried.

Mr. Ray Taylor representative of the A. J. Adams Co. addressed the Council re the Adams grader. On motion of Councillors Stewart and Farrow that we adjourn for lunch to 6 p.m. Carried.

Council resumed at 6 p.m. all members present, Reeve L. A. Hooton in the Chair. Considerable time was spent re the purchasing of a motor grader for the Township.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Farrow that subject to the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board, also Dept. of Highways that this Council purchase a Austin Western Grader, Model Paer 300 with Snow Plow Model Giant V and Snow Wing, Model Giant at a price of \$28,905.00 less a trade in allowance for Austin Western No. 99-H of \$10,000 net price \$18,905.00. Carried.
