South Monaghan Council Minutes

South Monaghan, Ont., April 6, 1959.—The regular monthly meeting of the Council of the Township of South Monaghan was held in the Township Hall on above date at 8 p.m. with all members present, Reeve George Dean occupied the chair.

The minutes of the previous regular and special meetings were read by the Clerk and adopted by the Council on motion by Herb Syer seconded by Gerald Anderson.

Mr. J. A. Gaynor, secretary-treasurer of the School Area Board was present and explained in detail the requisition of the Board which had been received in the Clerk's office.

Mr. Harry Campbell, the local member of the Peterborough District High School Board was in attendance and explained the requisition from that body.

Mr. A. J. DelPeiro interviewed the Council in regards to the building by-law.

Mr. Harry Larmer, inspector under the Warble Fly Act was present and discussed with the Council the rates to be charged this year. Accordingly on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by Jay Whittington it was agreed to maintain the same schedule of five cents per head for inspection and fifteen cents

per head for spraying. Mr. M. H. Thompson, the retiring road superintendent and Mr. Mel Heaslip who is taking over that position presented road voucher No. 3 in the amount of \$794.45, which was passed for payment on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by Gerald Anderson.

The following correspondence had been received and were presented by the Clerk— Division Registrar, with property transfers and account in the amount of \$1.73.

Attorney General's Department, enclosing a report of the findings of the jury enquiring into the death caused by the collapse of the arena at Listowell.

Department of Planning and Development enclosing a copy of the Conservation Authorities Act.

Department of Municipal Affairs, advising that the Federal-Provincial Works Program has been extended to May 31st.

W. K. Warrender, Minister of the Department of Municipal Affairs, telegram March 11th, advising of new regulations concerning school grants.

Department of Municipal Affairs, with regulations concerning hospital insurance for indigents and unemployed.

Ontario Hydro, two contracts which were change of ownership and were approved.

Department of Public Welfare, information re changes in Welfare Assistance Act in respect to residence qualifications and also a request for statements to March 31st, by April 10th.

United Counties Clerk's office enclosing hospital account for George Dundas in the amount of \$57.75 which was accepted.

Northumberland and Durham Health Unit report for February and also a letter from Dr. Charlotte Horner recommending an extension of post sanatorium care and relief for George Brock for another 3 months. In this respect the Clerk was asked to notify the Welfare Administrator of Peterborough that our Municipality accepts this responsibility on motion by Jay Whittington seconded by Herb Syer.
