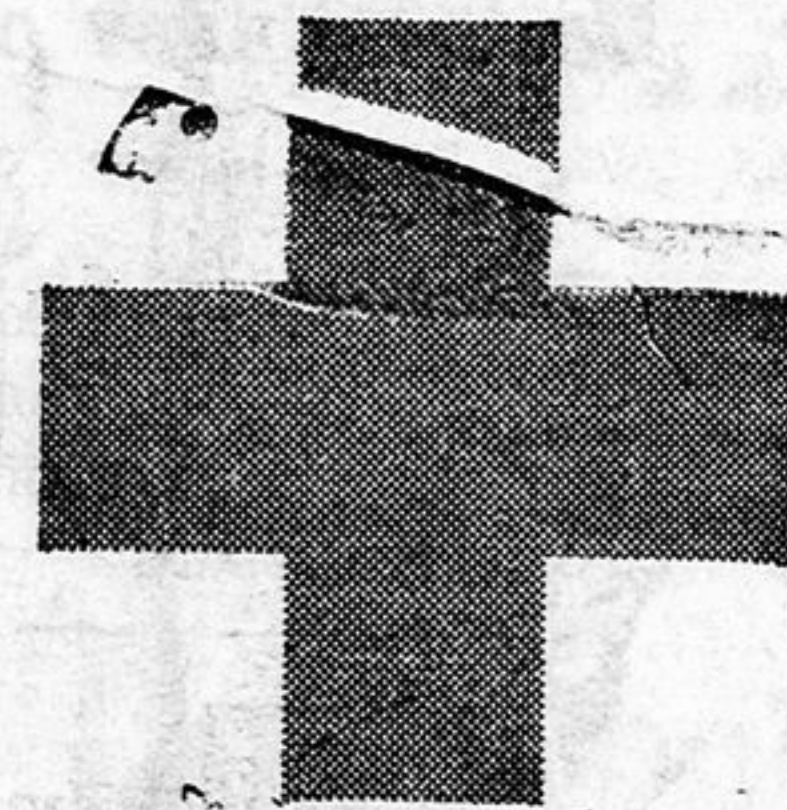
Dear Sir:  
On reading account of the recent fire in Millbrook in the Reporter received two days ago, feel that I, one of the oldest living former residents, must write to correct some of the statements you made.

To begin with, since the fire of 1875 there has never been a butcher shop on South side of King Street, nor before that either, as far as I have heard.

You, being one of the new residents, could not be expected to know Millbrook history of long ago, but whoever gave you information for articles was so wrong in many statements.

My father's block consisted of what was recently Country Fair and the lawyer's office. His own Dry Goods Store was the large one occupied by the Country Fair; and a Drug
