McGill of Manver, is on the road in this section for the season of 1893, and will stand over night at the Dominion hotel, Millbrook, on Mondays. The Thistle has proved himself to be a valuable stock getter, as one of his colts, owned by Mr. Wm. Philip, of Yelverton, has been chosen by the commission for exhibition at the world's fair.
