

### Millbrook Village Council Minutes

Municipality of Millbrook, May 6th, 1957.—A regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date.

Members present as follows:—Reeve Geo. F. Harrington, Councillors Weldon Coulter, Lavern Gibson, Frank North and George Raymes.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the Clerk and were confirmed on motion of Councillors North and Raymes.

The Ontario Water Resources Commission, regarding certificates of approval for water and sewage installations. The Ontario Municipal Association, announcing a Convention to be held in the Town of Whitby, Friday, June 7, 1957. Welfare Officers Association, annual meeting in Kingston, June 17-18 and 19th, 1957.

The Department of Highways, cheque enclosed \$1,485.18, balance

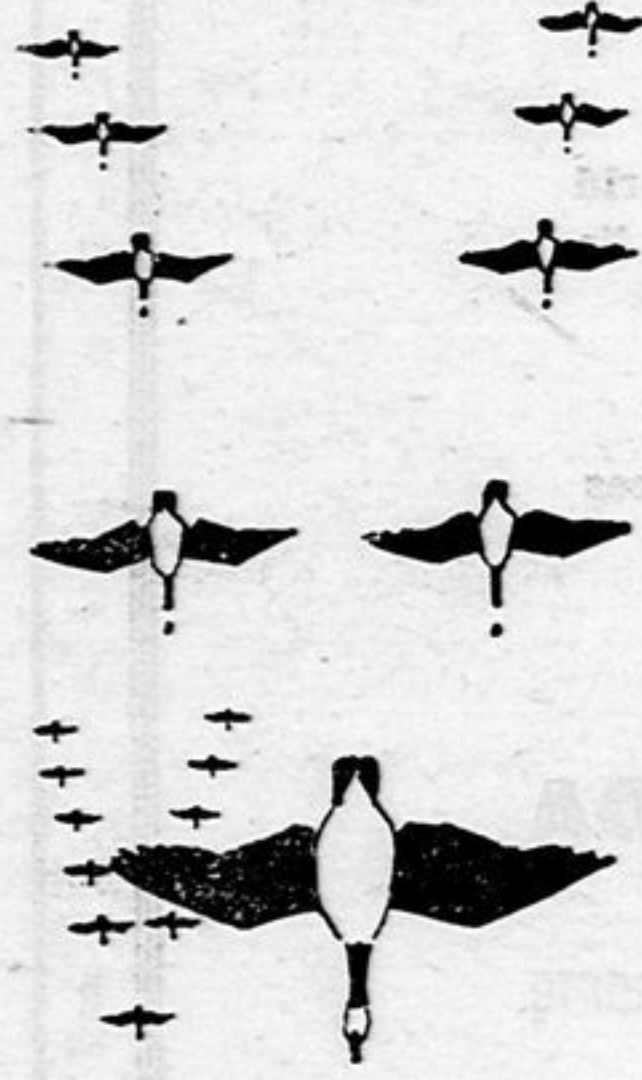

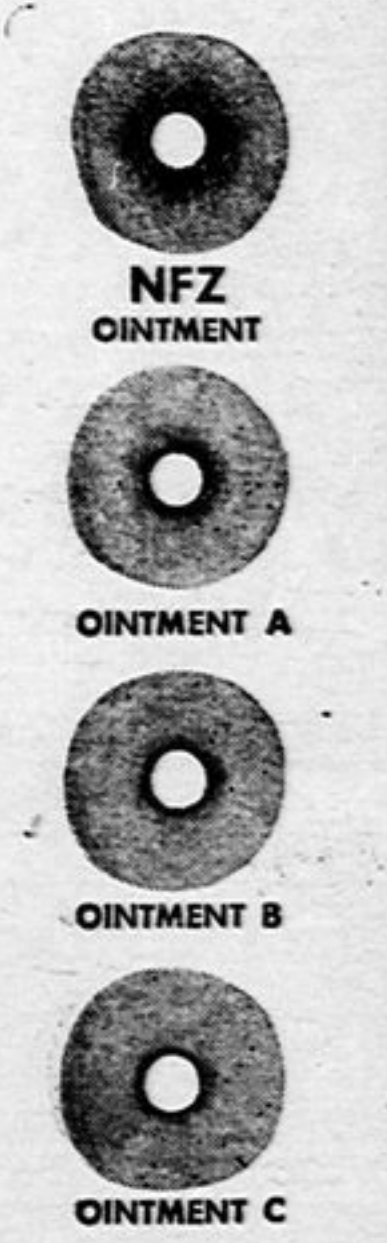
