MISSIONARY FROM INDIA WILL SHOW COLOURED SLIDES SATURDAY NIGHT

Mr. Angus MacKay who has spent almost thirty years in India will speak in the Presbyterian Churches, in Millbrook at 9.45 a.m. and South Monaghan at 11.15 a.m. on Sunday, June 2nd. He is a native of Ontario and taught school for five years before going to India. A graduate of Wingham High School and London Normal School he has also studied at Knox College and Toronto Bible College. Since 1927 he has served on the Jhansi field of the Canadian Presbyterian Mission in city

and village evangelism. For twelve years he has been principal of the Boy's Middle School, and has organized and acted as principal of the Bible Training School for seven years.

Mr. MacKay knows agricultural work and has supervised the twelve hundred acre Mission farm. Saturday evening, June 1st, at 8 p.m. Mr. MacKay will show coloured pictures in Grace Church Hall, Millbrook. 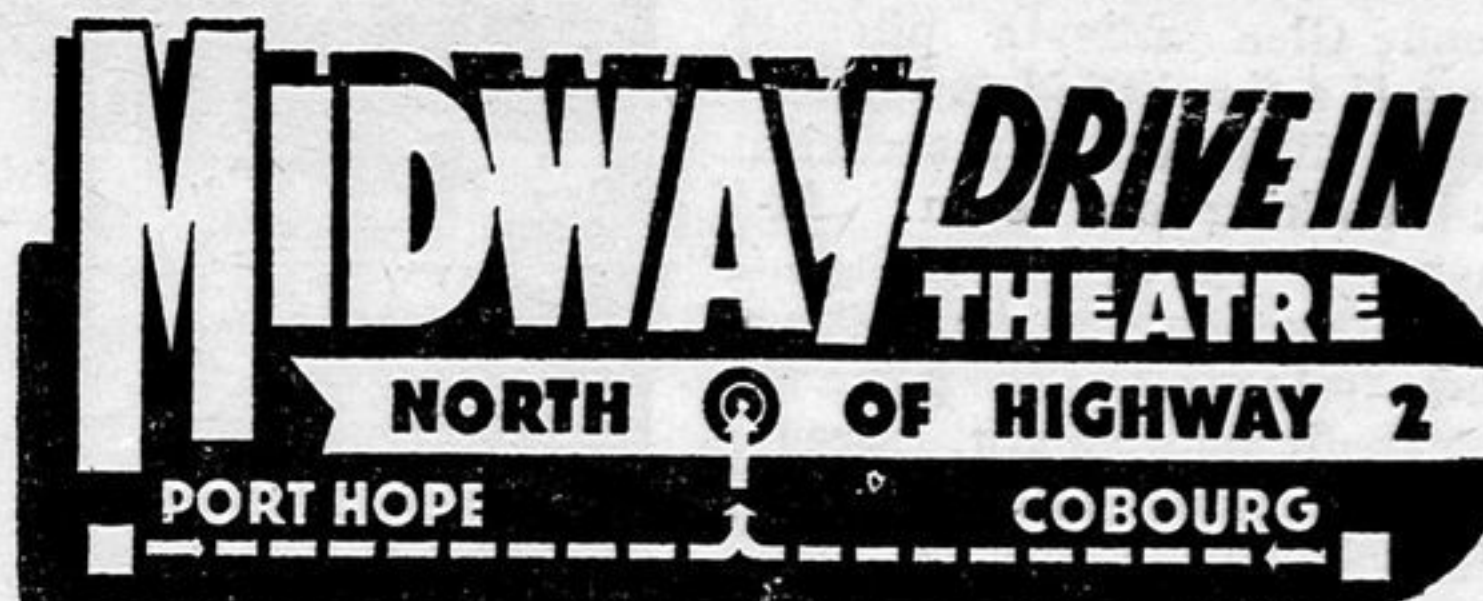
