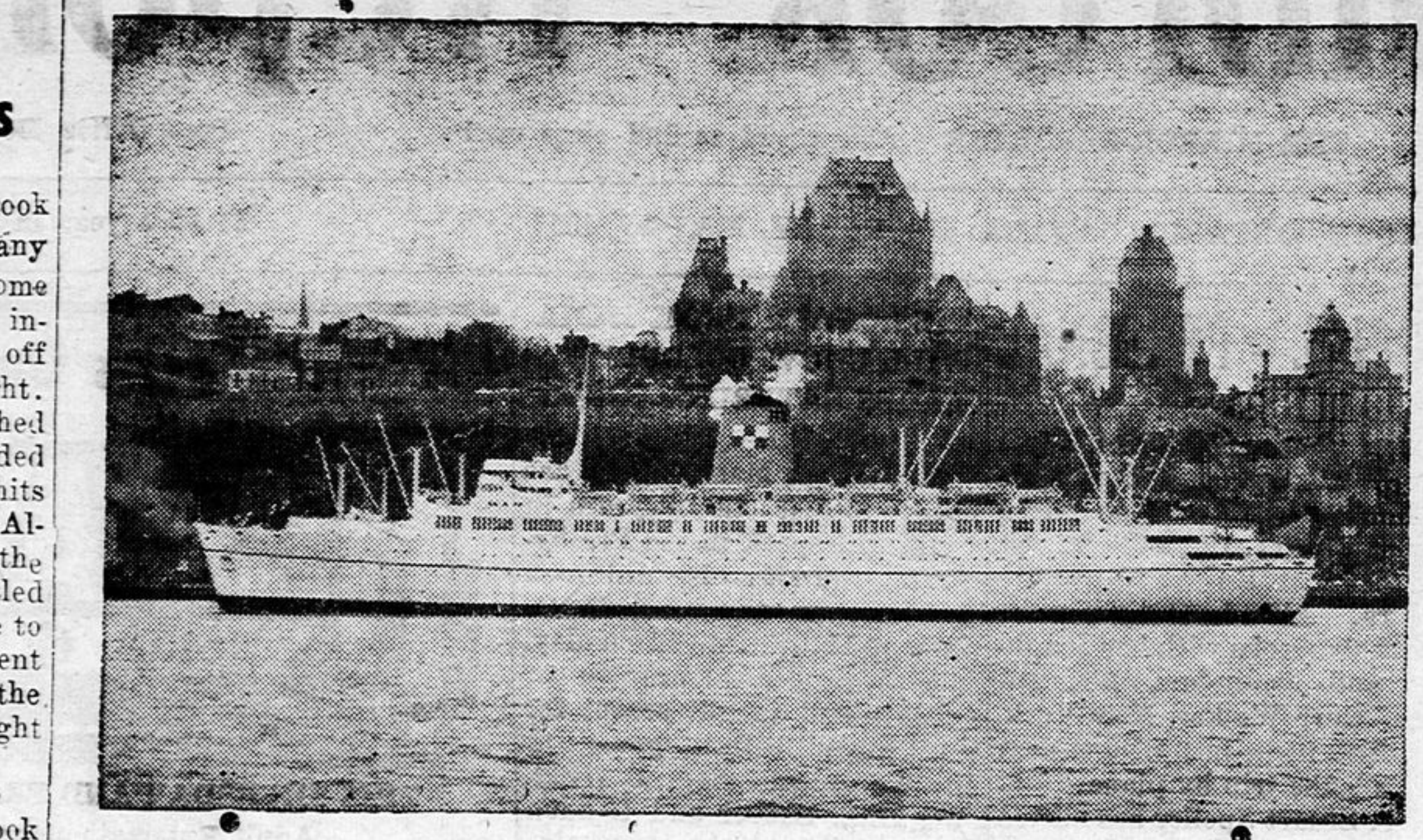

The white-hulled liner completed her maiden voyage from Liverpool to Montreal recently. Constructed with its sister ship, the "Empress of Britain", at a combined cost of \$35,000,000, the "Empress of England" is one of the most modern ships afloat and is completely air-conditioned. The Empresses of Britain, England, Scotland and France will make a total of 44 calls at Montreal during the season and provide accommodation for more than 75,000 travellers. The "Empress of England", with a service speed of 21 knots, has space for 150 first class passengers and 900 tourist.

#### HERE'S SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

"The outcome of the election in Durham riding is anybody's guess," Ken C. Toms, Social Credit candidate, stated today in presenting an analysis of the possibilities for the four candidates who are contesting the Federal seat June 10th.

Mr. Toms pointed out that in the past two Federal elections only 8,000 of the 19,000 registered electors voted in this riding. According to figures available from Carroll Nichols, returning officer, there are about 20,000 registered for this year's election.

"If the voters follow previous patterns, then there would be 12,000 of the 'silent vote' this year," Mr. Toms pointed out.

"However," he said, "the people in Durham riding this year are excited about the election. Last week in Blackstock the Farmer's Union brought out more than 200 people to hear the four candidates from Durham outline their policies. The Blackstock Recreation Centre was packed to the door. This can indicate but one thing; the citizens are interested in what each party has to offer. Therefore, if a large portion of the 12,000 previous non-voters turn out, it will be anybody's fight."

Mr. Toms further explained that the contest between the Liberal and Conservative candidates has been extremely close in the past two Federal elections. Last time the present sitting member, Hon. John James defeated his opponent by 180 votes. The election before that Mr. James defeated his opponent by better than 200 votes. This occurred in the face of better than 11,000 people staying home and not voting.

This year four candidates are vying for the 8,000 votes which can be expected to turn out, but the 'silent vote' (12,000) is an unknown quotient. Mr. Toms said. "The candidate who presents the best programme of action, based on logical precepts, designed to give this 'silent vote', uncommitted elector what he wants, will be the winner," Mr. Toms concluded.

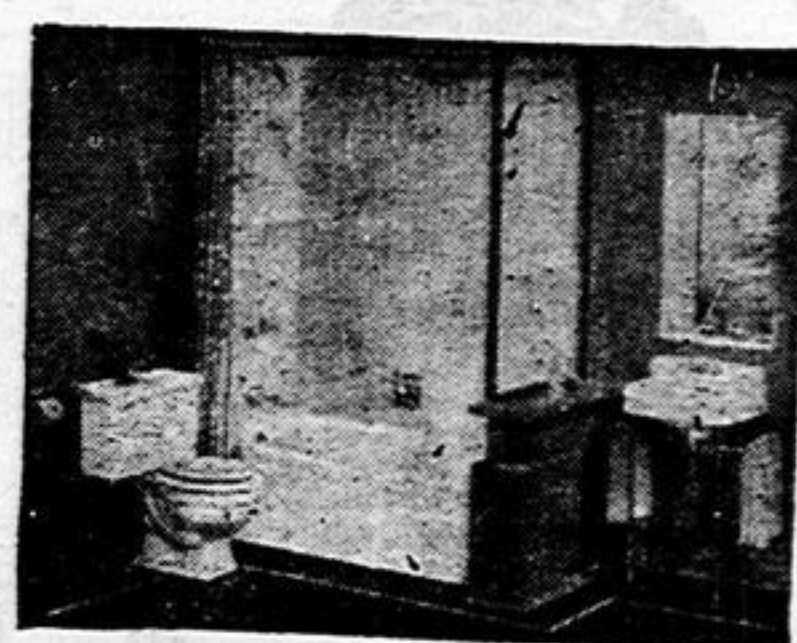
